2	A memorial to the Congress of the United States,
3	urging Congress to establish a child welfare block
4	grant in lieu of Title IV-E funding.
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6	WHEREAS, one of the most important roles of government is
7	ensuring the safety and well-being of society's most vulnerable
8	members, including children, and
9	WHEREAS, children enter the child welfare system for many
10	reasons, such as parental substance abuse, domestic violence,
11	mental illness, and generational poverty, and the complexity of
12	cases is growing due to the interplay of these factors, and
13	WHEREAS, preventing child abuse, abandonment, and neglect
14	saves children from trauma and avoids costs for more intensive
15	treatment services, juvenile justice interventions, public
16	benefits expenditures, and other social services, resulting in
17	long-term savings, and
18	WHEREAS, for children who suffer maltreatment and need
19	intensive services, a wide range of research-based service
20	models now exist to meet those needs, from in-home services to
21	therapeutic care in out-of-home settings, and
22	WHEREAS, with flexibility in use of federal funds for child
23	welfare services, professionals working closely with children
24	and families can tailor services to best meet individual needs,
25	regardless of the level of involvement in the child welfare
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26 system, thus making the most effective and efficient use of 27 funding, and

28 WHEREAS, Florida has been a national leader in innovative 29 child welfare service provision through a community-based system 30 of care and flexible funding streams, providing communities with 31 the responsibility, authority, and resources to care for their 32 own children, and

33 WHEREAS, while the federal Child and Family Services Review 34 found that Florida exceeds national standards with respect to 35 certain indicators and systemic factors, the state still faces 36 challenges in meeting other requirements and would benefit from 37 continued flexibility in federal funding to most effectively 38 meet these challenges, and

39 WHEREAS, Florida's Title IV-E waiver is due to end 40 September 30, 2018, and federal law requires all waiver 41 operations to terminate by September 30, 2019, such that Florida 42 will soon revert to more restrictive funding limitations unless 43 Congress takes action, and

44 WHEREAS, even the flexible Title IV-E waivers limit state45 action to a great degree, and

WHEREAS, widespread support exists nationally to transform the current Title IV-E funding approach to emphasize prevention and greater provision of a wider array of services tailored to meet individual families' needs so that children may be safe

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50 while avoiding the trauma of placement outside the home when 51 possible, NOW, THEREFORE,

53 Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

55 That the Legislature of the State of Florida requests the 56 United States Congress to establish a child welfare block grant 57 in lieu of Title IV-E funding, giving states the flexibility to 58 provide an expanded array of community-based programs and 59 supports to children who are in or who are at risk of entering 60 out-of-home placement, and their families; and

That under this block grant, eligibility be broadened to include any child in need, and that the total funding available to the state be sufficient to meet the needs of those children, based on factors that provide incentives for earlier intervention and efficient and effective service provision while taking into account population growth, changes in children's and families' needs, and inflation rates.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be dispatched to the President of the United States, to the President of the United States Senate, to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and to each member of the Florida delegation to the United States Congress.

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
