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## Amendment (with title amendment)

Remove lines 144-331 and insert:

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(3) (a) The list of court-related functions that clerks may

fund from filing fees, service charges, costs, and fines is

limited to those functions expressly authorized by law or court

rule. Those functions include the following: case maintenance;

records management; court preparation and attendance; processing

the assignment, reopening, and reassignment of cases; processing

of appeals; collection and distribution of fines, fees, service

payments; payment of jurors and witnesses; payment of expenses

charges, and court costs; processing of bond forfeiture

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for meals or lodging provided to jurors; data collection and
reporting; processing of jurors; determinations of indigent
status; and paying reasonable administrative support costs to
enable the clerk of the court to carry out these court-related
functions.

- (b) The list of court-related functions that clerks may not fund from filing fees, service charges, costs, and fines includes:
  - 1. Those functions not specified within paragraph (a).
- 2. Functions assigned by administrative orders which are not required for the clerk to perform the functions in paragraph (a).
- 3. Enhanced levels of service which are not required for the clerk to perform the functions in paragraph (a).
- 4. Functions identified as local requirements in law or local optional programs.
- Section 3. Paragraph (a) of subsection (2) and subsection (4) of section 28.36, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
- 28.36 Budget procedure.—There is established a budget procedure for the court-related functions of the clerks of the court.
- (2) Each proposed budget shall further conform to the following requirements:
- (a) On or before June 1 <del>of each year beginning in 2014,</del>
  the proposed budget shall be prepared, summarized, and submitted

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by the clerk in each county to the Florida Clerks of Court Operations Corporation in the manner and form prescribed by the corporation. The proposed budget must provide detailed information on the anticipated revenues available and expenditures necessary for the performance of the court-related functions listed in s. 28.35(3)(a) of the clerk's office for the county fiscal year beginning October 1.

- (4) The <u>corporation</u> <del>Legislative Budget Commission</del> may approve increases or decreases to the previously authorized budgets approved for individual clerks of the court pursuant to s. 28.35 for court-related functions, if:
- (a) The additional budget authority is necessary to pay the cost of performing new or additional functions required by changes in law or court rule; or
- (b) The additional budget authority is necessary to pay the cost of supporting increases in the number of judges or magistrates authorized by the Legislature.
- Section 4. Subsection (5) is added to section 40.29, Florida Statutes, to read:
  - 40.29 Payment of due-process costs.-
- (5) The Justice Administrative Commission shall provide funds to the clerks of the court to compensate jurors, pay for meals or lodging provided to jurors, and pay for jury-related personnel and other costs as provided in this section. Each clerk shall forward to the commission a quarterly estimate of

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the funds necessary to compensate jurors and pay for meals or
lodging to be provided to jurors during the upcoming quarter.
The Florida Clerks of Court Operations Corporation shall forward
to the commission a quarterly estimate of the amount necessary
to reimburse each clerk for his or her jury-related personnel
and other costs. Upon receipt of such estimates, the commission
shall determine the amount necessary to pay the clerks during
the upcoming quarter and submit a request for payment to the
Chief Financial Officer. If the commission believes that the
amount appropriated by the Legislature is insufficient to meet
such costs for the remaining part of the fiscal year, the
commission may apportion the funds appropriated in the General
Appropriations Act among the counties, basing the apportionment
upon the amount expended for such purposes in each county during
the prior fiscal year. The Chief Financial Officer shall issue
the appropriate apportioned amount by warrant to each county.
The clerks are responsible for compensating jurors, paying for
meals or lodging provided to jurors, and paying for jury-related
personnel and other costs that exceed the funding provided in
the General Appropriations Act for such purposes.

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s. 40.29, F.S.; requiring the Justice Administrative
Commission to provide funds to the clerks of the court
for certain jury-related expenses; requiring the
clerks and the Florida Clerks of Court Operations
Corporation to submit quarterly estimates of certain
expenses to the commission; providing procedures for
securing funds and distributing funds to the clerks;
authorizing the apportionment of General
Appropriations Act funds under certain conditions;
requiring the clerks to pay costs in excess of
appropriated amounts; providing an effective date.
