Section 1. Paragraph (p) of subsection (4) of section 394.495, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

394.495 Child and adolescent mental health system of care; 16 17 programs and services .-

- (4) The array of services may include, but is not limited
- 19 to: 20
  - (p) Trauma-informed services for children who have suffered sexual exploitation as defined in s. 39.01(70)(9). If there is no safe-harbor or trauma-informed housing available, the child may not be placed in a generic shelter setting. The department shall assemble a team consisting of at least two experts in anti-trafficking and sexual violence and at least one licensed psychiatrist or psychologist who has experience working with children who have suffered sexual exploitation. The team shall determine the safest placement for the child until an appropriate out-of-home care placement option becomes available. The child's placement must match his or her individual needs, avoid revictimization of the child, and provide safety.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2017.
