House Resolution

A resolution recognizing March 30, 2017, as "Dominican-American Heritage Day" in Florida.

WHEREAS, migration from the Dominican Republic to the United States began in the 1960s, in the wake of economic and political turbulence that occurred after dictator Rafael Trujillo was killed by rebels, and

WHEREAS, since 1990, the immigrant population from the Dominican Republic residing in the United States has been larger than other immigrant populations from the Caribbean, with the exception of immigrants from Cuba, and

WHEREAS, Florida has a longstanding tradition of acknowledging its richly diverse communities, and is one of five states with the largest concentration of Dominican Americans, and

WHEREAS, as of the 2010 census, there were over 170,000 Dominican Americans residing throughout the state, with the largest populations in Miami-Dade, Broward, Orange, and Hillsborough Counties, and

WHEREAS, Dominican Americans have been and continue to be a rich and unique addition to the state, sharing their diverse culture and cuisine, and

WHEREAS, Dominican Americans have made significant contributions to the United States in several fields, including
