House Resolution

A resolution designating September 2017 as "Gynecologic Cancer Awareness Month" in Florida.

5 WHEREAS, gynecologic cancer represents the uncontrolled 6 growth and spread of malignant cells originating in the female 7 reproductive organs, and

8 WHEREAS, it is estimated that in the United States, 71,500 9 women will be diagnosed with a gynecologic cancer and 10 approximately 26,500 women will succumb to the disease in 2017, 11 and

12 WHEREAS, cervical cancer occurs most often in women over 13 the age of 30 and it is estimated that, in 2017, 12,820 new 14 cases of cervical cancer will be diagnosed in the United States 15 and 4,210 women will die from the disease, and

16 WHEREAS, of all the gynecologic cancers, only cervical 17 cancer has proven prevention and screening tools, including the 18 Papanicolaou test, and

WHEREAS, the Papanicolaou test only screens for cervical cancer, and with no reliable way to screen for any other gynecologic cancer it is important that women recognize warning signs and understand risk reduction strategies, and

23 WHEREAS, the human papillomavirus (HPV) is the primary 24 cause of the majority of cases of cervical cancer, and that

25 discovery has resulted in the development and use of a vaccine 26 that could eliminate this disease, and 27 WHEREAS, uterine cancer, also known as endometrial cancer, starts in the uterus and typically affects women over the age of 28 29 50, and 30 WHEREAS, it is estimated that 61,380 women in the United 31 States will be diagnosed with uterine cancer and 10,920 women 32 will die from this cancer in 2017, and WHEREAS, ovarian cancer is the deadliest of all the 33 34 gynecologic cancers and all women are at risk for this cancer, 35 and 36 WHEREAS, 90 percent of women who get ovarian cancer are 37 over the age of 40, and in 2017, it is estimated that 22,440 new 38 cases will be diagnosed and 14,080 women will die from this form of cancer in the United States, and 39 40 WHEREAS, vulvar cancer, often linked to HPV, accounts for 41 approximately 4 percent of cancers of the female reproductive 42 organs and 0.6 percent of all cancers in women, and 43 WHEREAS, in 2017, it is estimated that 6,020 women in the 44 United States will be diagnosed with vulvar cancer and 1,150 45 women will die from this disease, and WHEREAS, each year, approximately 1,000 women in the United 46 47 States are affected by vaginal cancer, and while vaginal cancer 48 is very rare, when detected early, treatment of the disease is 49 most effective, and

50 WHEREAS, recent advances in cancer genetics have led to the identification of genes that may cause significantly increased 51 52 risk for certain cancers, and 53 WHEREAS, the purple ribbon is the international symbol for 54 gynecologic cancer awareness, and 55 WHEREAS, founded in 2011 and based in southwest Florida, 56 the Betty Allen Gynecologic Cancer Foundation is dedicated and 57 actively engaged in providing programs to help increase education and raise awareness about gynecologic cancers in order 58 59 to save lives, NOW, THEREFORE, 60 Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of 61 62 Florida: 63 64 That the Florida House of Representatives commends the 65 Betty Allen Gynecologic Cancer Foundation for its efforts to 66 educate residents in the state about gynecologic cancer and
