20	state a shark fin that has been separated from a shark or land a
21	separated shark fin in this state, unless such possession or
22	landing is authorized by commission rule.
23	(3)(a) Upon conviction of a violation of this section, any
24	commercial harvester shall be punished as follows:

27	imprisonment not to exceed 60 days. In addition, the commission

31	degree, punishable by a mandatory fine of \$10,000 and a term of
32	imprisonment not to exceed 12 months. In addition, the
