19	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

21	Section 1. Section 381.96, Florida Statutes, is created to
22	read:
23	381.96 Pregnancy support and wellness services
24	(1) DEFINITIONS As used in this section, the term:
25	(a) "Department" means the Department of Health.
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26	(b) "Eligible client" means a pregnant woman or a woman
27	who suspects she is pregnant, and the family of such woman, who
28	voluntarily seeks pregnancy support services and any woman who
29	voluntarily seeks wellness services.
30	(c) " Florida Pregnancy Care Network, Inc.," or "network"
31	means the not-for-profit statewide alliance of pregnancy support
32	organizations that provide pregnancy support and wellness
33	services through a comprehensive system of care to women and
34	their families.
35	(d) "Pregnancy support services" means services that
36	promote and encourage childbirth, including, but not limited to:
37	1. Direct client services, such as pregnancy testing,
38	counseling, referral, training, and education for pregnant women
39	and their families. A woman and her family shall continue to be
40	eligible to receive direct client services for up to 12 months
41	after the birth of the child.
42	2. Program awareness activities, including a promotional
43	campaign to educate the public about the pregnancy support
44	services offered by the network and a website that provides
45	information on the location of providers in the user's area, as
46	well as other available community resources.
47	3. Communication activities, including the operation and
48	maintenance of a hotline or call center with a single statewide
49	toll-free number that is available 24 hours a day for an
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50	eligible client to obtain the location and contact information
51	for a pregnancy center located in his or her area.
52	(e) "Wellness services" means services or activities
53	intended to maintain and improve health or prevent illness and
54	injury, including, but not limited to, high blood pressure
55	screening, flu vaccines, anemia testing, thyroid screening,
56	cholesterol screening, diabetes screening, assistance with
57	smoking cessation, and tetanus vaccines.
58	(2) DEPARTMENT DUTIESThe department shall contract with
59	the network for the management and delivery of pregnancy support
60	and wellness services to eligible clients.
61	(3) CONTRACT REQUIREMENTSThe department contract shall
62	specify the contract deliverables, including financial reports
63	and other reports due to the department, timeframes for
64	achieving contractual obligations, and any other requirements
65	the department determines are necessary, such as staffing and
66	location requirements. The contract shall require the network
67	to:
68	(a) Establish, implement, and monitor a comprehensive
69	system of care through subcontractors to meet the pregnancy
70	support and wellness needs of eligible clients.
71	(b) Establish and manage subcontracts with a sufficient
72	number of providers to ensure the availability of pregnancy
73	support and wellness services for eligible clients, and maintain
74	and manage the delivery of such services throughout the contract
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75	period.
76	(c) Spend at least 90 percent of the contract funds on
77	pregnancy support and wellness services.
78	(d) Offer wellness services through vouchers or other
79	appropriate arrangements that allow the purchase of services
80	from qualified health care providers.
81	(e) Require a background screening under s. 943.0542 for
82	all paid staff and volunteers of a subcontractor if such staff
83	or volunteers provide direct client services to an eligible
84	client who is a minor or an elderly person or who has a
85	disability.
86	(f) Annually monitor its subcontractors and specify the
87	sanctions that shall be imposed for noncompliance with the terms
88	of a subcontract.
89	(g) Subcontract only with providers that exclusively
90	promote and support childbirth.
91	(h) Ensure that informational materials provided to an
92	eligible client by a provider are current and accurate and cite
93	the reference source of any medical statement included in such
94	materials.
95	(4) SERVICESServices provided pursuant to this section
96	must be provided in noncoercive manner and may not include any
97	religious content.
98	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2017.

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
