45 To have access to and use of all files, records, and (2)46 data of the commission or the counties available to any other attorney representing parties in a proceeding before the 47 commission or the counties; 48

In any proceeding in which he or she has participated 49 (3) 50 as a party, to seek review of any determination, finding, or

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51 order of the commission or the counties, or of any hearing 52 examiner designated by the commission or the counties, in the 53 name of the state or its citizens; 54 To prepare and issue reports, recommendations, and (4) 55 proposed orders to the commission, the Governor, and the 56 Legislature on any matter or subject within the jurisdiction of 57 the commission, and to make such recommendations as he or she 58 deems appropriate for legislation relative to commission 59 procedures, rules, jurisdiction, personnel, and functions; and
