A bill to be entitled An act relating to alcohol deliveries; amending s.

561.57, F.S.; including an electronic order as a type of order construed as a sale made at a vendor's licensed place of business; authorizing a manufacturer, distributor, or vendor to contract with a third party for certain deliveries; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsections (1) and (2) of section 561.57, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

561.57 Deliveries by licensees.-

- (1) Vendors shall be permitted to make deliveries away from their places of business of sales actually made at the licensed place of business; provided, telephone, electronic, or mail orders received at <u>a</u> vendor's licensed place of business shall be construed as a sale actually made at the vendor's licensed place of business.
- (2) Deliveries made by a manufacturer, distributor, or vendor away from his or her place of business may be made only in vehicles that which are owned or leased by the licensee, or by third parties with whom the licensee has contracted to make deliveries, including, but not limited to, common carriers. By acceptance of an alcoholic beverage license and the use of such vehicles, the licensee agrees that such vehicle shall always be subject to be inspected and searched without a search warrant, for the purpose of ascertaining that all provisions of the
