6 Between lines 230 and 231, insert:

7 Section 6. Subsections (9) and (10) of section 402.305,
8 Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

9 402.305 Licensing standards; child care facilities.—

10 (9) ADMISSIONS AND RECORDKEEPING.—

11 (a) Minimum standards shall include requirements for
12 preadmission and periodic health examinations, requirements for
13 immunizations, and requirements for maintaining emergency
14 information and health records on all children.

15 (b) During the months of August and September of each
16 year, each child care facility shall provide parents of children

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17 enrolled in the facility detailed information regarding the
18 causes, symptoms, and transmission of the influenza virus in an
19 effort to educate those parents regarding the importance of
20 immunizing their children against influenza as recommended by
21 the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices of the Centers
22 for Disease Control and Prevention.

23 (c) During the months of April and September of each year,
24 at a minimum, each facility shall provide parents of children
25 enrolled in the facility information regarding the potential for
26 a distracted adult to fail to drop off a child at the facility
27 and instead leave the child in the adult's vehicle upon arrival
28 at the adult's destination. The child care facility shall also
29 give parents information about resources with suggestions to
30 avoid this occurrence. The department shall develop a flyer or
31 brochure with this information that shall be posted to the
32 department's website, which child care facilities may choose to
33 reproduce and provide to parents to satisfy the requirements of
34 this paragraph.

35 (d) ~~(e)~~ Because of the nature and duration of drop-in child
36 care, requirements for preadmission and periodic health
37 examinations and requirements for medically signed records of
38 immunization required for child care facilities shall not apply.
39 A parent of a child in drop-in child care shall, however, be
40 required to attest to the child's health condition and the type
41 and current status of the child's immunizations.

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42 (e)~~(d)~~ Any child shall be exempt from medical or physical
43 examination or medical or surgical treatment upon written
44 request of the parent or guardian of such child who objects to
45 the examination and treatment. However, the laws, rules, and
46 regulations relating to contagious or communicable diseases and
47 sanitary matters shall not be violated because of any exemption
48 from or variation of the health and immunization minimum
49 standards.

50 (10) TRANSPORTATION SAFETY.—Minimum standards shall
51 include requirements for child restraints or seat belts in
52 vehicles used by child care facilities and large family child
53 care homes to transport children, requirements for annual
54 inspections of the vehicles, limitations on the number of
55 children in the vehicles, procedures to avoid leaving children
56 in vehicles when transported by the facility, and accountability
57 for children ~~being~~ transported by the child care facility.
58 Facilities shall not be responsible for children when they are
59 transported by a parent or guardian.

60 Section 7. Subsection (15) is added to section 402.313,
61 Florida Statutes, to read:

62 402.313 Family day care homes.—

63 (15) During the months of April and September of each
64 year, at a minimum, each family day care home shall provide
65 parents of children attending the family day care home
66 information regarding the potential for a distracted adult to

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67 fail to drop off a child at the family day care home and instead
68 leave the child in the adult's vehicle upon arrival at the
69 adult's destination. The family day care home shall also give
70 parents information about resources with suggestions to avoid
71 this occurrence. The department shall develop a flyer or
72 brochure with this information that shall be posted to the
73 department's website, which family day care homes may choose to
74 reproduce and provide to parents to satisfy the requirements of
75 this paragraph.

76 Section 8. Subsection (10) is added to section 402.3131,
77 Florida Statutes, to read:

78 402.3131 Large family child care homes.—

79 (10) During the months of April and September of each
80 year, at a minimum, each large family child care home shall
81 provide parents of children attending the large family child
82 care home information regarding the potential for a distracted
83 adult to fail to drop off a child at the large family child care
84 home and instead leave the child in the adult's vehicle upon
85 arrival at the adult's destination. The large family child care
86 home shall also give parents information about resources with
87 suggestions to avoid this occurrence. The department shall
88 develop a flyer or brochure with this information that shall be
89 posted to the department's website, which large family child
90 care homes may choose to reproduce and provide to parents to
91 satisfy the requirements of this paragraph.
