

1 A bill to be entitled
 2 An act relating to anatomical gifts; amending s.
 3 765.511, F.S.; defining the term "nonprofit surgical
 4 training center"; amending s. 765.513, F.S.;
 5 authorizing nonprofit surgical training centers to
 6 become donees of anatomical gifts if specified
 7 criteria are met; providing an effective date.
 8

9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
 10

11 Section 1. Subsections (15) through (23) of section
 12 765.511, Florida Statutes, are renumbered as subsections (16)
 13 through (24), respectively, and a new subsection (15) is added
 14 to that section, to read:

15 765.511 Definitions.—As used in this part, the term:
 16 (15) "Nonprofit surgical training center" means a
 17 nonprofit center, owned by a statutory teaching hospital as
 18 defined in s. 408.07(45), that offers multidisciplinary learning
 19 opportunities, including a minimum of 100 hours per year of
 20 continuing medical education courses approved by the Board of
 21 Medicine or the appropriate regulatory board.

22 Section 2. Paragraph (d) is added to subsection (1) of
 23 section 765.513, Florida Statutes, to read:

24 765.513 Donees; purposes for which anatomical gifts may be
 25 made.—

26 (1) The following persons or entities may become donees of
27 anatomical gifts of bodies or parts of them for the purposes
28 stated:

29 (d) A nonprofit surgical training center if the center:

30 1. Does not provide human remains to another facility.

31 2. Contracts with a funeral director licensed under
32 chapter 497 for the disposal and transportation of the human
33 remains.

34 3. Promotes its anatomical gift program only in hospitals,
35 nursing homes, or hospice programs that are wholly owned or
36 controlled, directly or indirectly, by the same parent company
37 that owns the nonprofit surgical training center.

38 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2018.
