| 22 | adults between the ages of 16 and 21, are most commonly impacted |

20181164 32-01548-18 30 cases resulting in death, and 31 WHEREAS, there are vaccines that help provide protection 32 against all five serogroups commonly seen in the United States, 33 and 34 WHEREAS, vaccination for serogroups A, C, W, and Y is 35 routinely recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and 36 Prevention (CDC), and 37 WHEREAS, the CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices recommends that decisions to vaccinate adolescents and 38 39 young adults ages 16 to 23 against serogroup B meningococcal 40 disease should be made at the individual level in consultation with their health care providers, and 41 42 WHEREAS, the recent incidences of meningococcal disease have served as a reminder of the critical role that vaccinations 43 44 play in helping to prevent this devastating illness and to 45 maintain public health, NOW, THEREFORE,
