A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the homestead exemption for disabled first responders; amending s. 196.102, F.S.; revising the definition of the term "first responder" to include law enforcement officers, correctional officers, firefighters, emergency medical technicians, or paramedics whose injuries are certified by their employing organizations to be caused by service in the line of duty on September 11, 2001, in New York City while responding to terrorist attacks; conforming a provision to changes made by the act; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) and subsection (2) of section 196.102, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

196.102 Exemption for certain totally and permanently disabled first responders; surviving spouse carryover.—

- (1) As used in this section, the term:
- (b) "First responder" has the same meaning as in s.

 196.081, except the term also includes a law enforcement
 officer, a correctional officer, a firefighter, an emergency
 medical technician, or a paramedic whose employing
 organization's certificate states that his or her injuries were
 caused by service in the line of duty on September 11, 2001, in
 New York City, New York, while responding to terrorist attacks.
- (2) Any real estate that is owned and used as a homestead by a person who has a total and permanent disability as a result

of an injury or injuries sustained in the line of duty while serving as a first responder in this state, or during an operation in another state or country authorized by this state or a political subdivision of this state, or while serving as a first responder in New York City and responding to the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks as provided in paragraph (1)(b), is exempt from taxation if the first responder is a permanent resident of this state on January 1 of the year for which the exemption is being claimed.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2018.
