5	Section 35. Effective upon becoming a law, section
6	324.252, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
7	324.252 Motor vehicle insurance online verification
8	system
9	(1) The department shall establish an online verification
10	system for motor vehicle insurance, with the goal of identifying
11	uninsured motorists and aiding the department in enforcing the
12	financial responsibility laws. The online verification system is
13	subject to the following:
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14	(a) The verification system shall be accessible through
15	the Internet by authorized personnel of the department, the
16	courts, law enforcement personnel, any other entities authorized
17	by the department, and insurers authorized by the Office of
18	Insurance Regulation to offer motor vehicle insurance.
19	(b) The verification system shall provide for real-time
20	access to insurers' records by personnel authorized by the
21	department.
22	(c) The department shall conduct a pilot program to test
23	the system before statewide use.
24	(d) The verification system must be installed and
25	operational by July 1, 2021. The department shall conduct a
26	pilot program lasting at least 9 months to test the system
27	before statewide use. The system may not be used in any
28	enforcement action until the pilot program is completed.
29	(e) The verification system shall be available 24 hours a
30	day, except as provided in paragraph (f), to verify the
31	insurance status of any vehicle registered in this state through
32	the vehicle's identification number, policy number or other
33	identifying characteristic or marker as specified by the
34	advisory council.
35	(f) Insurer systems are permitted reasonable downtime
36	outages for maintenance and other work, upon advance notice to
37	the department. Insurers are not subject to administrative
38	penalties or disciplinary actions under such circumstances or
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39	when systems are not available because of outages that are
40	unplanned by the insurer and reasonably outside its control.
41	(g) The department may contract with a private vendor to
42	assist in establishing and maintaining the verification system.
43	(h) The verification system shall include appropriate
44	provisions, consistent with industry standards, as specified by
45	the advisory council, to secure its data against unauthorized
46	access and to maintain a record of all information requests. A
47	historical record of the system data must be retained by
48	insurers for 5 years after the policy termination date.
49	(i) A law enforcement officer, during a traffic stop or
50	crash investigation, shall access information from the online
51	verification system to establish compliance with this chapter
52	and to verify the current validity of the policy described on
53	any insurance identification card produced by the operator of a
54	motor vehicle during the traffic stop or crash investigation.
55	(j) The verification system must include a disaster
56	recovery plan designed to ensure service continuity in the event
57	of a disaster.
58	(k) The verification system must include information that
59	enables the department to make inquiries of evidence of
60	insurance by using multiple data elements for greater matching
61	accuracy, specifically: insurer National Association of
62	Insurance Commissioners (NAIC) company code, Vehicle
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63	Identification Number, policy number or other data elements as
64	specified by the advisory council.
65	(1) An insurance company authorized to issue motor vehicle
66	insurance policies in this state must comply with the
67	verification requirements of motor vehicle insurance for every
68	motor vehicle insured by that company in this state as required
69	by department rule.
70	(m) This section does not apply to vehicles insured under
71	commercial motor vehicle coverage. For purposes of this
72	paragraph, the term "commercial motor vehicle coverage" means
73	any coverage provided to an insured under a commercial coverage
74	form and rated from a commercial manual approved by the Office
75	of Insurance Regulation. However, insurers of such vehicles may
76	participate on a voluntary basis.
77	(2)(a) The department shall establish an advisory council
78	to:
79	1. Facilitate the implementation of the online insurance
80	verification system, including to recommend data and cyber
81	security processes and protocols.
82	2. Assist in the development of a detailed guide for
83	insurers providing for the data fields and other information
84	necessary for compliance along with other necessary regulations.
85	3. Coordinate and conduct a testing phase as prescribed by
86	the advisory council.

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87	4. Identify necessary changes during the testing phase, as
88	prescribed by the advisory council.
89	5. Issue recommendations based on periodic reviews of the
90	online insurance verification system by the advisory council.
91	The advisory council shall issue a report to the department, the
92	President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of
93	Representatives 1 year after the online insurance verification
94	system is implemented to evaluate the system's effectiveness in
95	identifying uninsured motorists, and annually thereafter on or
96	before January 1 of each year. The advisory council may also
97	issue recommendations for system enhancements in such report.
98	(b) The advisory council shall consist of nine voting
99	members as follows:
100	1. Three representatives of the Department of Highway
101	Safety and Motor Vehicles selected by the director;
102	2. One representative of the Office of Insurance
103	Regulation selected by the Commissioner of Insurance;
104	3. Three insurance industry representatives selected by
105	the Commissioner of Insurance;
106	4. One representative from the Department of Financial
107	Services selected by the Chief Financial Officer of the
108	Insurance Industry Committee on Motor Vehicle Administration;
109	and
110	5. One representative of the Agency for State Technology
111	selected by the executive director of the agency.
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112	(c) The council shall be chaired by the executive director
113	of the department.
114	(d) The advisory council shall convene by August 1, 2018.
115	(3) Insurers must cooperate with the department in
116	establishing and maintaining the insurance verification system
117	and must provide access to motor vehicle insurance policy status
118	information.
119	(4) An insurer is immune from civil liability for good
120	faith efforts to comply with the provisions of this act. An
121	online verification request or response may not be used as the
122	basis of a civil action against an insurer.
123	(5) The department shall cooperate with the advisory
124	council and insurers in developing and operating the online
125	verification system.
126	(6) The department may adopt rules to implement this
127	section.

139	available. In such a case, the department and its authorized
140	agent may accept proof of purchase as provided in this
141	subsection to verify the purchase of the required insurance
142	before processing any application for motor vehicle
143	registration.

151	insurance company's database, as provided in s. 324.252. This
152	paragraph does not relieve an insurance company from the

156	active insurance policies, commonly known as the "book of
157	business," to enable the department to identify uninsured
158	vehicles.
