26 (3) In accordance with s. 19(f)(2), Art. III of the State 27 Constitution, the trust fund shall, unless terminated sooner, be 28 terminated on July 1, 2022. Before its scheduled termination, 29 the trust fund shall be reviewed as provided in s. 215.3206(1) 30 and (2). Section 2. This act shall take effect on the same date 31 that HB 1405 or similar legislation takes effect, if such 32 33 legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law, and only if this act is 34 35 enacted by a three-fifths vote of the membership of each house 36 of the Legislature.
