An act relating to the Emergency Power Systems
Matching Grant Program; providing a short title;
providing legislative intent; defining the term
"emergency power system"; requiring the Department of
Health to establish and administer the Emergency Power
Systems Matching Grant Program to provide state
matching funds to certain public and private health
care facilities for specified years on a first-come,
first-served basis; prohibiting a public or private
health care facility from receiving more than one
grant per county per year; requiring the department to
adopt rules; providing an appropriation; providing an
effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. (1) SHORT TITLE.—This section may be cited as the "Emergency Power Systems Matching Grant Program."

(2) LEGISLATIVE INTENT.—The Legislature recognizes the importance of public and private health care facilities in providing emergency health services and understands that by having power readily available, the professionals, staff, and patients will experience less stress during power outages and electric service interruptions that occur during major natural disasters. The Legislature understands the fiscal constraints which many public and private health care facilities operate within in order to provide a safe and comfortable atmosphere while providing essential medical services. The Legislature

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intends to offset fiscal difficulties by creating a 5-year matching grant program to assist public and private health care facilities that were constructed and operational before July 2018 in acquiring emergency power systems.

- (3) DEFINITIONS.—As used in this section, the term
 "emergency power system" means a system that provides an
 independent source of electric power during the loss of power
 supply and includes a supply of fuel sufficient to sustain the
 emergency power source for at least 7 days during a power
 outage. An emergency power system may include a generator,
 batteries, and other accessories needed to power such emergency
 power system.
- (4) ADMINISTRATION.—The Department of Health shall establish and administer the Emergency Power Systems Matching Grant Program. The program shall:
- (a) Provide state matching funds on a first-come, first-served basis to public or private health care facilities that apply for funds with the department.
- (b) Prohibit a public or private health care facility from receiving more than one grant per county per year under this program.
- (5) RULEMAKING AUTHORITY.—The department shall adopt rules to implement this section.
- Section 2. For the 2018-2019 fiscal year, and each fiscal year through the 2022-2023 fiscal year, the sum of \$5 million in nonrecurring funds is appropriated to the Department of Health to implement the Emergency Power Systems Matching Grant Program.
 - Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2018.
