4 Remove lines 3818-3860 of the amendment and insert:

5 Section 22. For the 2018-2019 fiscal year:

6 (1) The nonrecurring sum of \$27,035,532 is appropriated
7 from the Federal Grants Trust Fund to the Department of Children
8 and Families for expenditure of funds related to the second year
9 of the State Targeted Response to the Opioid Crisis grant, to
10 increase access to treatment, reduce unmet treatment needs, and
11 reduce opioid overdose-related deaths through prevention,
12 treatment, and recovery activities.

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13 (2) To enhance the entire substance abuse continuum of
14 care, the sum of \$14,626,911 in recurring funds is appropriated
15 from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Children and
16 Families for community-based services to address the opioid
17 crisis, including, but not limited to, outreach, addiction
18 treatment, and recovery support services. Funding under this
19 subsection shall be used to expand capacity to increase access
20 to and reduce waitlists for treatment; increase efforts to
21 effectively engage and retain in treatment youth, pregnant
22 women, high-risk populations, and high utilizers of acute care
23 services; and further develop a recovery-based model of care.
24 Funding for specific services may include, but are not limited
25 to, case management, residential services, outpatient services,
26 aftercare services, and medication-assisted treatment.
27 Medication-assisted treatment may include, but is not limited
28 to, methadone, buprenorphine, and naltrexone extended release
29 injectable.

30 (3) The recurring sum of \$5,000,000 from the General
31 Revenue Fund is appropriated to the Department of Health for the
32 purchase of emergency opioid antagonists to be made available to
33 emergency responders.

34 (4) The recurring sum of \$6 million from the General
35 Revenue Fund is appropriated to the Office of State Court
36 Administrator for medication-assisted treatment of substance
37 abuse disorders in individuals involved in the criminal justice

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38 system, individuals who have a high likelihood of becoming
39 involved in the criminal justice system, or individuals who are
40 in court-ordered, community-based drug treatment. Such
41 medication-assisted treatment may include, but is not limited
42 to, methadone, buprenorphine, and naltrexone extended release
43 injectable.

44 (5) The sums of \$873,089 in recurring funds and \$117,700
45 in nonrecurring funds are appropriated from the General Revenue
46 Fund to the Department of Health for improvements to the
47 Prescription Drug Monitoring Program system pursuant to s.
48 893.055, Florida Statutes.

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
