Proposed Committee Substitute by the Committee on Appropriations (Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government)

A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Department of Management Services; creating the Statewide Procurement Efficiency Task Force within the department; specifying the purpose and membership of the task force; providing meeting requirements; providing for administrative and technical support of the task force; providing that task force members shall serve without compensation or reimbursement of expenses; requiring the task force to submit a report to the Governor and the Legislature by a certain date; providing for the termination of the task force; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Statewide Procurement Efficiency Task Force.-There is created the Statewide Procurement Efficiency Task Force for the purpose of evaluating the effectiveness and value of state and local procurement laws and policies to the taxpayers of this state and determining where inconsistencies in such laws and policies exist.

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(1) The task force is composed of the following members:

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(a) The Secretary of Management Services or his or her designee, who shall serve as chair of the task force.

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- (b) Seven members appointed by the Governor, as follows:
- 1. One county government official.



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- 2. One municipal government official.
- 3. One district school board member.
- 4. One professional engineer licensed under chapter 471, Florida Statutes.
- 5. One general contractor as defined in s. 489.105(3)(a), Florida Statutes.
- 6. The chairs of the governing boards of two water management districts.
- (c) Two members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, as follows:
 - 1. A member of the House of Representatives.
- 2. An attorney who is a member in good standing of The Florida Bar and has expertise in procurement law.
- (d) Two members appointed by the President of the Senate, as follows:
 - 1. A member of the Senate.
- 2. An attorney who is a member in good standing of The Florida Bar and has expertise in procurement law.
- (e) The Chief Financial Officer, or his or her designee who must be an employee of the Department of Financial Services.
- (f) The state chief information officer or his or her designee.
- (2) Task force members must be appointed by July 31, 2018. By August 31, 2018, the task force shall meet to establish procedures for the conduct of its business and to elect a vice chair. The task force shall meet at the call of the chair. A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum, and a quorum is necessary for the purpose of voting on any action or recommendation of the task force. All meetings shall



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be held in Tallahassee, unless otherwise decided by the task force, and then no more than two such meetings may be held in other locations for the purpose of taking public testimony. Administrative and technical support shall be provided by the department. Task force members shall serve without compensation and are not entitled to reimbursement for per diem or travel expenses.

- (3) The task force must submit a final report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by July 1, 2019. Such report must, at a minimum, include recommendations for consideration by the Legislature to promote procurement efficiency, streamline procurement policies, establish best management practices, and encourage increased use of state term contracts.
 - (4) The task force is terminated December 31, 2019. Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
