15	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

17	Section 1. Paragraphs (f) and (h) of subsection (1) and
18	subsection (7) of section 458.311, Florida Statutes, are amended
19	to read:
20	458.311 Licensure by examination; requirements; fees
21	(1) Any person desiring to be licensed as a physician, who
22	does not hold a valid license in any state, shall apply to the
23	department on forms furnished by the department. The department
24	shall license each applicant who the board certifies:
25	(f) Meets one of the following medical education and
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26	postgraduate training requirements:
27	1.a. Is a graduate of an allopathic medical school or
28	allopathic college recognized and approved by an accrediting
29	agency recognized by the United States Office of Education or is
30	a graduate of an allopathic medical school or allopathic college
31	within a territorial jurisdiction of the United States
32	recognized by the accrediting agency of the governmental body of
33	that jurisdiction;
34	b. If the language of instruction of the medical school is
35	other than English, has demonstrated competency in English
36	through presentation of a satisfactory grade on the <u>Test of</u>
37	English as a Foreign Language Test of Spoken English of the
38	Educational Testing Service or a similar test approved by rule
39	of the board; and
40	c. Has completed an approved residency of at least 1 year.
41	2.a. Is a graduate of an allopathic foreign medical school
42	registered with the World Health Organization and certified
43	pursuant to s. 458.314 as having met the standards required to
44	accredit medical schools in the United States or reasonably
45	comparable standards;
46	b. If the language of instruction of the foreign medical
47	school is other than English, has demonstrated competency in
48	English through presentation of the Educational Commission for
49	Foreign Medical Graduates English proficiency certificate or by
50	a satisfactory grade on the <u>Test of English as a Foreign</u>

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51	Language Test of Spoken English of the Educational Testing
52	Service or a similar test approved by rule of the board; and
53	c. Has completed an approved residency of at least 1 year.
54	3.a. Is a graduate of an allopathic foreign medical school
55	which has not been certified pursuant to s. 458.314;
56	b. Has had his or her medical credentials evaluated by the
57	Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates, holds an
58	active, valid certificate issued by that commission, and has
59	passed the examination utilized by that commission; and
60	c. Has completed an approved residency of at least 1 year;
61	however, after October 1, 1992, the applicant shall have
62	completed an approved residency or fellowship of at least 2
63	years in one specialty area. However, to be acceptable, the
64	fellowship experience and training must be counted toward
65	regular or subspecialty certification by a board recognized and
66	certified by the American Board of Medical Specialties.
67	4.a. Is a graduate of an allopathic foreign medical school
68	that is listed in the World Directory of Medical Schools
69	produced by the World Federation for Medical Education and the
70	Foundation for Advancement of International Medical Education
71	and Research, in collaboration with the World Health
72	Organization, that is accredited by an accrediting agency
73	recognized by the appropriate governmental body in the foreign
74	jurisdiction, but which has not been certified pursuant to s.
75	<u>458.314;</u>
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76 b. If the language of instruction of the foreign medical 77 school is other than English, has demonstrated competency in 78 English through presentation of a satisfactory grade on the Test 79 of English as a Foreign Language of the Educational Testing 80 Service or a similar test approved by rule of the board; 81 c. Has completed an approved residency or fellowship of at 82 least 1 year in one specialty area. However, to be acceptable, 83 the fellowship experience and training must be counted toward 84 regular or subspecialty certification by a board recognized and 85 certified by the American Board of Medical Specialties; and d. Has held an active physician license and practiced 86 87 medicine in a foreign jurisdiction for at least 5 years 88 immediately preceding the application for licensure under this 89 section. 90 Has obtained a passing score, as established by rule (h) of the board, on the licensure examination of the United States 91 92 Medical Licensing Examination (USMLE); or a combination of the 93 United States Medical Licensing Examination (USMLE), the 94 examination of the Federation of State Medical Boards of the 95 United States, Inc. (FLEX), or the examination of the National

96 Board of Medical Examiners up to the year 2000; or for the 97 purpose of examination of any applicant who was licensed on the 98 basis of a state board examination and who is currently licensed 99 in at least one other jurisdiction of the United States or 100 Canada, and who has practiced pursuant to such licensure for a

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period of at least 10 years, use of the Special Purpose 101 102 Examination of the Federation of State Medical Boards of the 103 United States (SPEX) upon receipt of a passing score as 104 established by rule of the board. An applicant meeting the 105 medical education and postgraduate training requirements in 106 subparagraph (f)4. may meet the examination requirement of this 107 paragraph by obtaining a passing score on an examination 108 determined by the board to be substantially equivalent to or 109 more stringent than the United States Medical Licensing Examination (USMLE). However, for the purpose of examination of 110 any applicant who was licensed on the basis of a state board 111 112 examination prior to 1974, who is currently licensed in at least three other jurisdictions of the United States or Canada, and 113 114 who has practiced pursuant to such licensure for a period of at 115 least 20 years, this paragraph does not apply. (7) Upon certification by the board, the department shall 116

117 impose conditions, limitations, or restrictions on a license if 118 the applicant is on probation in another jurisdiction for an act 119 that which would constitute a violation of this chapter. The 120 board may certify an applicant for licensure who has met the 121 medical education and postgraduate training requirements under 122 subparagraph (1)(f)4. and all other licensure requirements with a condition, limitation, or restriction, including, but not 123 limited to, a probationary period of practice, a scope of 124 125 practice limitation, or a supervision requirement, which shall

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126 be imposed by the department for a duration specified by the 127 board. 128 Section 2. Section 458.3126, Florida Statutes, is created 129 to read: 130 458.3126 Limited license for general practice for foreign-131 trained physicians; requirements.-132 (1) A person may apply for a limited license for general 133 practice if he or she: 134 (a) Has been a resident of this state for at least 3 years 135 at the time of application. 136 (b) Is a graduate of an allopathic foreign medical school 137 that: 1. Is listed in the World Directory of Medical Schools 138 139 produced by the World Federation for Medical Education and the 140 Foundation for Advancement of International Medical Education 141 and Research, in collaboration with the World Health 142 Organization. 143 2. Has been evaluated by the National Committee on Foreign 144 Medical Education and Accreditation. 145 3. Participates in the William D. Ford Federal Direct 146 Student Loan Program. (c) Has demonstrated competency in English through 147 148 presentation of a satisfactory grade on the Test of English as a 149 Foreign Language of the Educational Testing Service or a similar 150 test approved by rule of the board if he or she attended a

153	(d) Has obtained translation of his or her medical degree
154	by an entity approved by the board, if necessary.
155	(e) If not qualified for admission to a residency program
156	in the United States, has:
157	1. Held an active physician license in a foreign
158	jurisdiction as certified by the appropriate physician licensing
159	agency in such jurisdiction.
160	2. Completed 5 or more years of practice as a licensed
161	physician in the foreign jurisdiction.
162	(f) Has completed one of the following:
163	1. Nine hundred hours in an accredited medical school
164	residency program in this state that is approved by the board
165	and similar in curriculum to the residency requirement in
166	<u>458.311(1)(f)2.c.;</u>
167	2. A passing score on Steps I, II, and III of the United
168	States Medical Licensing Examination; or
169	3. Active licensure for at least 3 years in the state as
170	an advanced registered nurse practitioner, physician assistant,
171	or house physician.
172	(g) Has practiced for at least 3 years under the
173	supervision of a board-certified physician in internal medicine,
174	family medicine, pediatrics, or a faculty member of a medical
175	school or a statutorily accredited medical school program. Such

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176	practice requirement may be served concurrently with the service
177	requirement in paragraph (h).
178	(h) Has completed 1 year of employment, service, or
179	volunteer work in a federally qualified health center, area of
180	critical need, safety net hospital, rural hospital, or otherwise
181	underserved area or population, which may be served concurrently
182	with the practice requirement in paragraph (f).
183	(2) A limited license for general practice does not
184	include the practice of any medical specialty.
185	(3) This section is repealed effective July 1, 2023,
186	unless reviewed and saved from repeal by the Legislature.
187	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2018.

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
