12	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

14	Section 1. This act may be cited as the "Florida
15	Infectious Disease Elimination Act (IDEA)."
16	Section 2. Subsection (4) of section 381.0038, Florida
17	Statutes, is amended to read:
18	381.0038 Education; sterile needle and syringe exchange
19	pilot program.—The Department of Health shall establish a
20	program to educate the public about the threat of acquired
21	immune deficiency syndrome.
22	(4) The following eligible entities The University of
23	Miami and its a ffiliates may establish a single sterile needle
24	and syringe exchange pilot program <mark>: a hospital licensed under</mark>
25	chapter 395, a health care clinic licensed under part X of
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26 chapter 400, an accredited medical school, a substance abuse 27 treatment program, or an HIV or AIDS service organization in 28 Miami-Dade County. A pilot program must notify the department 29 when the pilot program is established and provide the name and 30 address of the pilot program, the name of the eligible entity 31 operating the program, and the name, address, and telephone 32 number of a contact person. A The pilot program may be operated 33 operate at a fixed location or through a mobile health unit by an eligible entity. A The pilot program shall offer the free 34 35 exchange of clean, unused needles and hypodermic syringes for 36 used needles and hypodermic syringes as a means to prevent the 37 transmission of HIV, AIDS, viral hepatitis, or other blood-borne 38 diseases among intravenous drug users and their sexual partners 39 and offspring.

(a) A The pilot program must:

1. Provide for maximum security of exchange sites and equipment, including an accounting of the number of needles and syringes in use, the number of needles and syringes in storage, safe disposal of returned needles, and any other measure that may be required to control the use and dispersal of sterile needles and syringes.

47 2. Operate a one-to-one exchange, whereby the participant
48 shall receive one sterile needle and syringe unit in exchange
49 for each used one.

3. Make available educational materials and referrals to

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51 education regarding the transmission of HIV, viral hepatitis, 52 and other blood-borne diseases; provide referrals for drug abuse 53 prevention and treatment; and provide or refer for HIV and viral 54 hepatitis screening.

(b) The possession, distribution, or exchange of needles or syringes as part of <u>a</u> the pilot program established under this subsection is not a violation of any part of chapter 893 or any other law.

(c) A pilot program staff member, volunteer, orparticipant is not immune from criminal prosecution for:

61 1. The possession of needles or syringes that are not a62 part of the pilot program; or

63 2. The redistribution of needles or syringes in any form,64 if acting outside the pilot program.

A The pilot program must collect data for quarterly, 65 (d) annual, and final reporting purposes. The annual report must 66 67 include information on the number of participants served, the 68 number of needles and syringes exchanged and distributed, the 69 demographic profiles of the participants served, the number of 70 participants entering drug counseling and treatment; the number 71 of participants receiving testing for HIV, AIDS, viral 72 hepatitis, or other blood-borne diseases; and other data necessary for the pilot program. However, personal identifying 73 74 information may not be collected from a participant for any 75 purpose. Quarterly reports must be submitted to the department

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76	of Health in Miami-Dade County by October 15, January 15, April
77	15, and July 15 of each year. An annual report must be submitted
78	to the department of Health by August 1 every year until the
79	program expires. A final report is due on August 1, <u>2023</u> 2021 ,
80	to the department of Health and must describe the performance
81	and outcomes of the pilot program and include a summary of the
82	information in the annual reports for all pilot program years.
83	(e) State, county, or municipal funds may not be used to
84	operate <u>a</u> the pilot program. <u>A</u> The pilot program <u>must</u> shall be
85	funded through grants and donations from private resources and
86	funds.
87	(f) <u>All</u> The pilot programs established under this
88	subsection program shall expire July 1, 2023 2021.
89	Section 3. If any provision of this act or its application
90	to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity
91	does not affect other provisions or applications of the act
92	which can be given effect without the invalid provision or
93	application, and to this end the provisions of this act are
94	severable.
95	Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2018.

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
