27	(7) The citizen support organization shall provide for an
28	independent annual financial audit in accordance with s.
29	215.981. Copies of the audit shall be provided to the
30	department, the Office of Policy and Budget in the Executive
31	Office of the Governor, and the <del>Florida</del> Cabinet.

41	disabilities established under section 1004.55. Each center that
42	opts to join the project shall distribute <del>to provide</del> personal
43	devices to aid search-and-rescue efforts for persons with
44	special needs in the case of elopement.
45	(b) There is created an additional pilot project in Palm
46	Beach County to provide personal devices to aid search-and-
47	rescue efforts for persons with special needs in the case of
48	elopement.

50	Hillsborough County to provide personal devices to aid search-

53	(2) <del>(a)1.</del> Participants for the <del>pilot</del> project <del>specified in</del>
54	<del>paragraph (1)(a)</del> shall be selected based on criteria developed
55	by the Center for Autism and Related Disabilities <u>based on the</u>
56	specific needs of each center's service area counties prescribed
57	under s. 1004.55 at the University of Florida.

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sheriff's offices of the participating counties. The devices shall be distributed to project participants by the county sheriff's offices in conjunction with the respective center. The respective center shall fund any costs associated with monitoring the devices.

81 (4) Each center shall submit a preliminary report by 82 December 1, 2016, and a final report by December 15, 2017, to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of 83 the House of Representatives describing the implementation and 84 85 operation of its pilot project. At a minimum, each report must 86 include the criteria used to select participants, the number of 87 participants, the nature of the participants' special needs, the 88 number of participants who elope, the amount of time taken to 89 rescue such participants following elopement, and the outcome of any rescue attempts. Each final report shall also provide 90 recommendations for modification or continued implementation of 91 92 the project.

93 <u>(4) (5)</u> The Each project shall operate to the extent of 94 available funding within the respective center's existing 95 resources.
