However, a registered pharmacy 83 technician may compound and dispense medicinal drugs when 84 operating under the electronic supervision of an off-site pharmacist pursuant to s. 465.0198. All such delegated acts must 85 be performed under the direct supervision of a licensed 86 87 pharmacist who is responsible for all such acts performed by persons under his or her supervision.
