1 A bill to be entitled 2 An act relating to cardiopulmonary resuscitation in 3 public schools; creating s. 1003.457, F.S.; requiring school districts to provide instruction in 4 5 cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of an 6 automated external defibrillator; requiring students 7 to study and practice psychomotor skills associated 8 with CPR at least once before graduating from high 9 school; requiring the instruction to be a part of a 10 required curriculum; providing instruction to be based on certain programs; providing an exemption; amending 11 12 s. 1003.453, F.S.; revising provisions relating to 13 first aid training, to conform; providing an effective 14 date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 1003.457, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

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1003.457 Instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation.-(1) Each school district shall provide instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and the use of an automated external defibrillator. Students shall study and practice the psychomotor skills associated with performing CPR at least once before graduating from high school. The instruction shall be a

27	curriculum selected by the school district.
28	(2) The instruction shall be based on an instructional
29	<pre>program established by:</pre>
30	(a) The American Heart Association;
31	(b) The American Red Cross; or
32	(c) Another nationally recognized program that uses the
33	most current evidence-based emergency cardiovascular care
34	guidelines.
35	(3) A student with a disability, as defined in s. 1007.02,
36	is exempt from the requirements of this section.
37	Section 2. Subsection (3) of section 1003.453, Florida
38	Statutes, is amended to read:
39	1003.453 School wellness and physical education policies;
40	nutrition guidelines.—
41	(3) School districts are encouraged to provide basic
42	training in first aid, including cardiopulmonary resuscitation,
43	for all students, beginning in grade 6 and every 2 years
44	thereafter. Private and public partnerships for providing
45	training or necessary funding are encouraged.
46	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2018.

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
