1 House Resolution 2 A resolution designating May 2018 as "Bladder Cancer 3 Awareness Month" in Florida. 4 5 WHEREAS, according to the National Cancer Institute, 6 bladder cancer is the sixth most common cancer, and 7 WHEREAS, as of 2017, Florida has the second highest average 8 number of bladder cancer diagnoses per year, and 9 WHEREAS, bladder cancer is the fourth most common cancer in 10 men, and approximately 696,440 people live with bladder cancer, 11 and 12 WHEREAS, men have a 1 in 26 chance and women have a 1 in 88 chance of being diagnosed with bladder cancer in their 13 14 lifetimes, and WHEREAS, in 2017, approximately 79,030 new cases of bladder 15 16 cancer were diagnosed, and an estimated 16,870 people died from 17 the disease, and WHEREAS, bladder cancer can occur at any age, but a high 18 19 percentage of people suffering from the disease are older than 55, and 20 21 WHEREAS, even though bladder cancer is the sixth most common cancer, there is far less bladder cancer awareness and 22 23 research than for other commonly diagnosed cancers, and WHEREAS, smoking and exposure to certain chemicals may 24 25 increase a person's likelihood of developing bladder cancer, and
