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12	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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14	Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subsection (5) of section
15	212.08, Florida Statutes, is amended, and paragraph (t) is added
16	to that subsection, to read:
17	212.08 Sales, rental, use, consumption, distribution, and
18	storage tax; specified exemptions.—The sale at retail, the
19	rental, the use, the consumption, the distribution, and the
20	storage to be used or consumed in this state of the following
21	are hereby specifically exempt from the tax imposed by this
22	chapter.
23	(5) EXEMPTIONS; ACCOUNT OF USE.—
24	(a) Items in agricultural use and certain netsThere are
25	exempt from the tax imposed by this chapter nets designed and
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26 used exclusively by commercial fisheries; disinfectants, 27 fertilizers, insecticides, pesticides, herbicides, fungicides, 28 and weed killers used for application on crops or groves, 29 including commercial nurseries and home vegetable gardens, used in dairy barns or on poultry farms for the purpose of protecting 30 31 poultry or livestock, or used directly on poultry or livestock; 32 animal health products that are administered to, applied to, or 33 consumed by livestock or poultry to alleviate pain or cure or prevent sickness, disease, or suffering, including, but not 34 35 limited to, antiseptics, absorbent cotton, gauze for bandages, lotions, vaccines, vitamins, and worm remedies; aquaculture 36 37 health products that are used by aquaculture producers, as 38 defined in s. 597.0015, to prevent or treat fungi, bacteria, and 39 parasitic diseases; portable containers or movable receptacles in which portable containers are placed, used for processing 40 farm products; field and garden seeds, including flower seeds; 41 42 nursery stock, seedlings, cuttings, or other propagative 43 material purchased for growing stock; seeds, seedlings, 44 cuttings, and plants used to produce food for human consumption; 45 cloth, plastic, and other similar materials used for shade, 46 mulch, or protection from frost or insects on a farm; stakes used by a farmer to support plants during agricultural 47 48 production; generators used on poultry farms; and liquefied petroleum gas or other fuel used to heat a structure in which 49 50 started pullets or broilers are raised; however, such exemption

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51 is not allowed unless the purchaser or lessee signs a 52 certificate stating that the item to be exempted is for the 53 exclusive use designated herein. Also exempt are cellophane 54 wrappers, glue for tin and glass (apiarists), mailing cases for 55 honey, shipping cases, window cartons, and baling wire and twine 56 used for baling hay, when used by a farmer to contain, produce, 57 or process an agricultural commodity. 58 (t) Equipment used to generate emergency electric energy.-59 1. The purchase of any equipment that uses natural gas or 60 liquefied petroleum gas to generate emergency electric energy at nursing homes and assisted living facilities. The electric 61 62 energy which is generated must be used at the facility and meet 63 the fuel needs for emergency generation for that size and class 64 of facility. 65 2. The purchaser of the emergency electric equipment must 66 provide the dealer with an affidavit certifying that the 67 equipment will only be used as set forth in subparagraph 1. A 68 person furnishing a false affidavit to the dealer is subject to 69 the penalty set forth in s. 212.085 and as otherwise provided by 70 law. 3. The exemption is limited to a maximum of \$30,000 for the 71 72 purchase of equipment for any one facility. 73 4. The department may adopt rules to implement this 74 exemption. 75 Section 2.
