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House Resolution

A resolution recognizing May 2018 as "American Stroke Month" in Florida.

5 WHEREAS, stroke is the fifth leading cause of death in the 6 United States, killing almost 140,000 people each year, and

7 WHEREAS, more than 795,000 people suffer from a stroke in 8 the United States each year, and

9 WHEREAS, stroke is a leading cause of long-term disability 10 and the leading preventable cause of disability in the United 11 States, and

12 WHEREAS, stroke-related health care services, prescribed 13 treatments, and missed days of work cost the United States an 14 estimated \$34 billion annually, and

WHEREAS, many people in the United States are unaware of the risk factors for a stroke, which include high blood pressure, high cholesterol, smoking, obesity, and diabetes, and

WHEREAS, the American Stroke Association's "Together to End Stroke" initiative helps people learn how to recognize and respond to stroke warning signs and symptoms using the acronym "FAST," in which "F" stands for face drooping, "A" stands for arm weakness, "S" stands for speech difficulty, and "T" stands for time to call 911 if any signs are present, and

24 WHEREAS, to improve stroke outcomes, we must bring 25 awareness to other stroke warning signs and symptoms, including

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sudden onset of numbness or weakness of the face, arm, or leg, especially on one side of the body; confusion, trouble speaking, or trouble understanding when being spoken to; difficulty seeing out of one or both eyes; trouble walking, dizziness, or loss of balance or coordination; or severe headache with no known cause, and

32 WHEREAS, during May 2018, the goal of the "Together to End 33 Stroke" initiative is to inform Americans that strokes are 34 largely preventable, treatable, and beatable and to increase 35 awareness and inspire action with respect to prevention, acute 36 treatment, and post-stroke rehabilitation, NOW, THEREFORE,

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38 Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of 39 Florida:

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That May 2018 is recognized as "American Stroke Month" in Florida and that all residents of this state are urged to familiarize themselves with the risk factors, warning signs, and symptoms associated with stroke, and, at the first sign of a stroke, to dial 911, so that we may begin to reduce the devastating effects of stroke on our population and all Floridians may live stronger, healthier lives.

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
