The alarm 16 monitoring company central monitoring station must attempt to 17 confirm employ call-verification methods for the premises generating the alarm signal a second time via communication with 18 19 the owner, occupant, or an authorized designee associated with 20 the premises if the first attempt to confirm call is 21 unsuccessful not answered. However, alarm signal confirmation 22 verification calling is not required if:

(1) The intrusion/burglary alarm has a properly operating visual or auditory sensor that enables the <u>alarm</u> monitoring personnel to verify the alarm signal; or

26 (2) The intrusion/burglary alarm is installed on a premises 27 that is used for the storage of firearms or ammunition by a 28 person who holds a valid federal firearms license as a 29 manufacturer, importer, or dealer of firearms or ammunition, 30 provided the customer notifies the alarm monitoring company that 31 he or she holds such license and would like to bypass the two-32 attempt confirmation two-call verification protocol. Upon 33 initiation of a new alarm monitoring service contract, the alarm 34 monitoring company shall make reasonable efforts to inform a customer who holds a valid federal firearms license as a 35 36 manufacturer, importer, or dealer of firearms or ammunition of 37 his or her right to opt out of the two-attempt confirmation two-38 call verification protocol.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2018.
