21	(b) For any period of time if the motor of the vehicle is
22	running, the health of the child is in danger, or the child
23	appears to be in distress.
24	(2) Any person who violates <u>subsection (1)</u> the provisions
25	of paragraph (1)(a) commits a misdemeanor of the second degree <u>,</u>
26	punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
27	(3) Any person who violates the provisions of paragraph
28	(1)(b) is guilty of a noncriminal traffic infraction, punishable
