39 responsible for oversight of the pilot project and shall adopt 40 procedures and guidelines to ensure the proper operation of the 41 pilot project, the proper handling of hemp material and 42 products, compliance with state and federal law, and the safety 43 and security of the pilot project facility. 45 (a) Designate the physical location, global positioning 46 system position, and map of the pilot project facility. Areas 47 within the facility must be designated as general access or 48 limited access.
