Such foreign 99 education and training must have been received in an institution 100 or program of higher education officially recognized by the 101 government of the country in which it is located as an 102 institution or program to train students to practice as 103 professional marriage and family therapists or psychotherapists. 104 The burden of establishing that the requirements of this 105 provision have been met shall be upon the applicant, and the 106 board shall require documentation, such as, but not limited to, 107 an evaluation by a foreign equivalency determination service, as 108 evidence that the applicant's graduate degree program and 109 education were equivalent to an accredited program in this 110 country. An applicant with a master's degree from a program 111 which did not emphasize marriage and family therapy may complete the coursework requirement in a training institution fully 112 113 accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Marriage and Family Therapy Education recognized by the United States 114 Department of Education. 115

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(c) Has had at least 2 years of clinical experience during

An individual who intends to practice in Florida to 122 123 satisfy the clinical experience requirements must register 124 pursuant to s. 491.0045 before commencing practice.
