18	Section 1. Subsection (4) of section 465.019, Florida

21	(4) Medicinal drugs shall be dispensed in an institutional
22	pharmacy to outpatients only when that institution has secured a
23	community pharmacy permit from the department. However, an
24	individual licensed to prescribe medicinal drugs in this state
25	may <u>be dispensed by</u> dispense up to a 24-hour supply of a

75 pharmacist responsible for verifying the accuracy of the dosage 76 and directions and providing patient counseling. 77 (f) The automated pharmacy system ensures the 78 confidentiality of personal health information.

79 (3) (2) Medicinal drugs stored in bulk or unit of use in an 80 automated pharmacy system servicing a long-term care facility, 81 hospice, or correctional institution, or for outpatient 82 dispensing, are part of the inventory of the pharmacy providing pharmacy services to that facility, hospice, or institution, or 83 84 for outpatient dispensing, and medicinal drugs delivered by the automated pharmacy system are considered to have been dispensed 85 86 by that pharmacy.

87 (4) (4) (3) The operation of an automated pharmacy system must 88 be under the supervision of a Florida-licensed pharmacist 89 licensed in this state. To qualify as a supervisor for an 90 automated pharmacy system, the pharmacist need not be physically 91 present at the site of the automated pharmacy system and may 92 supervise the system electronically. The Florida-licensed 93 pharmacist shall be required to develop and implement policies 94 and procedures designed to verify that the medicinal drugs 95 delivered by the automated dispensing system are accurate and valid and that the machine is properly restocked. 96

97 <u>(5)</u> (4) The Legislature does not intend this section to 98 limit the current practice of pharmacy in this state. This 99 section is intended to allow automated pharmacy systems to

enhance the ability of a pharmacist to provide pharmacy services in locations that do not employ a full-time pharmacist. This section does not limit or replace the use of a consultant pharmacist.

104 <u>(6) (5)</u> The board shall adopt rules governing the use of an 105 automated pharmacy <u>systems</u> system by January 1, 2005, which must 106 include specify:

- 107 (a) Recordkeeping requirements.;

(c) Labeling requirements that permit the use of unit-dose medications if the facility, hospice, or institution maintains medication-administration records that include directions for use of the medication and the automated pharmacy system identifies:
