7	Section 1. Subsection (6) is added to section 327.4109,
8	Florida Statutes, to read:
9	327.4109 Anchoring or mooring prohibited; exceptions;

11	(6)(a) As used in this subsection, the term "long-term
12	stored vessel" means a vessel on the waters of the state that is
13	not under the supervision and control of a person capable of
14	operating and maintaining it or moving it from one location to
15	another and which has remained anchored or moored outside of a
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16	public mooring field for at least 30 days out of a 60-day
17	period.
18	(b) The commission shall conduct, or contract with a
19	private vendor to conduct a study, for no longer than 2 years,
20	of the impacts of long-term stored vessels on local communities
21	and the state.
22	(c) The study shall:
23	1. Investigate if and to what extent long-term stored
24	vessels or vessels anchored or moored for more than 30 days
25	contribute to the number of derelict and abandoned vessels on
26	the waters of the state.
27	2. Investigate the impacts of long-term stored vessels and
28	vessels, vessels anchored or moored for more than 30 days, and
29	vessels moored within public mooring fields on the local and
30	state economies, public safety, and the environment during and
31	after significant tropical storm and hurricane events.
32	3. Provide recommendations for appropriate management
33	options for long-term stored vessels or vessels anchored or
34	moored for more than 30 days to mitigate any identified negative
35	impacts to local communities and the state.
36	(d) The commission shall submit a report of its findings
37	and recommendations to the Governor, the President of the
38	Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives within 6
39	months of completing of the study.

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40	(e) This subsection is contingent upon an appropriation by
41	the Legislature.
42	(e) This subsection expires January 1, 2024.
43	Section 2. Subsection (6) is added to section 823.11,
44	Florida Statutes, to read:
45	823.11 Derelict vessels; relocation or removal; penalty
46	(6) If an owner or responsible party of a derelict vessel
47	has been charged by an officer of the commission or any law
48	enforcement agency or officer specified in s. 327.70 for a
49	violation of subsection (2) or a violation of s. 376.15(2), a
50	person may not reside or dwell on such vessel until the vessel
51	is removed from the waters of the state permanently or returned
52	to the waters of the state in a condition that is no longer
53	derelict.
