 2 Representative DuBose offered the following:

**Amendment**

Remove lines 26-33 and insert:

ordinance or regulation that:

7 (a) Is of a general nature and does not specifically  
 8 regulate vegetable gardens, including, but not limited to,  
 9 regulations and ordinances relating to water use during drought  
 10 conditions, fertilizer use, or control of invasive species.

11 (b) Caps the percentage of a front yard that may be  
 12 covered by a vegetable garden at a maximum of 60 percent or  
 13 less.

14 (c) Caps the percentage of a street-side yard that may be  
 15 covered by a vegetable garden at a maximum of 60 percent or  
 16 less.

Amendment No.

17 (d) Prohibits vegetable gardens in the public right-of-way  
18 and public-services easement areas.

19 (e) Requires vegetable gardens to be set back from  
20 property lines by up to 3 feet.

21 (f) Caps the maximum height of vegetation and related  
22 gardening accessories at 5 feet or less.

23 (g) Prohibits vegetation and related gardening accessories  
24 from obscuring building addresses and the main entrance of  
25 residential structures.

26 (h) Prohibits commercial uses of residential properties.

27 (4) As used in this section, the term "vegetable garden"  
28 means a plot of ground where herbs, fruits, flowers, or  
29 vegetables are cultivated for human ingestion.

30 (5) This section does not affect private declarations of  
31 covenants, controls, and restrictions on real property.
