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20	Section 1. Effective September 1, 2020, paragraph (a) of		
21	subsection (1) and subsection (5) of section 320.055, Florida		
22	Statutes, are amended to read:		
23	320.055 Registration periods; renewal periods.—The		
24	following registration periods and renewal periods are		
25	established:		
26	(1)(a) For a motor vehicle subject to registration under s.		
27	320.08(1), (2), (3), (4)(a) or (b), (5)(b), (c), (d), or (f),		
28	(6)(a), (7), (8), (9), or (10) and owned by a natural person,		
29	the registration period begins the first day of the birth month		
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30	of the owner and ends the last day of the month immediately			
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35	For a vehicle subject to this registration period, the renewal			
36	period is the 30-day period ending at midnight on the vehicle			
37	owner's date of birth.			
38	(5) For a vehicle subject to apportioned registration under			
39	s. 320.08(4)(c), (d), (e), (f), (g), (h), (i), (j), (k), (l),			
40	(m), or (n) $\frac{1}{320.08(4)}$ , (5)(a)1. or, (e), (6)(b), or (14), the			
41	registration period shall be a period of 12 months beginning in			
42	a month designated by the department and ending on the last day			
43	of the 12th month. For a vehicle subject to this registration			
44	period, the renewal period is the last month of the registration			
45	period. The registration period may be shortened or extended at			
46	the discretion of the department, on receipt of the appropriate			
47	prorated fees, in order to evenly distribute such registrations

54	Section 2. In order to implement the changes made by this			
55	act to s. 320.055, Florida Statutes, the Department of Highway			
56	Safety and Motor Vehicles may develop and employ methods			
57	including, but not limited to, prorating registration fees for			
58	vehicles subject to registration under s. 320.08(4)(a) or (b),			
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59	Florida Statutes, based on the number of months in the vehicle
60	registration period. Proration is limited to the renewal of an
61	unexpired registration or a registration that has been expired
62	for no more than 30 days.

93	semiannually, if the amount of license tax due annually is more

101	(c) In making application for transfer of title from a			
102	deceased titled owner, the new owner or surviving coowner shall			
103	establish proof of ownership by submitting with the application			
104	the original certificate of title and the decedent's probated			
105	last will and testament or letters of administration appointing			
106	the personal representative of the decedent. In lieu of a			
107	probated last will and testament or letters of administration, a			
108	copy of the decedent's death certificate or death records			
109	maintained by the Department of Health and provided to a Florida			
110	tax collector, a copy of the decedent's last will and testament,			
111	and an affidavit by the decedent's surviving spouse or heirs			
112	affirming rights of ownership may be accepted by the department.			
113	If the decedent died intestate, a court order awarding the			
114	ownership of the vessel or an affidavit by the decedent's
