## Amendment (with title amendment)

Remove lines 258-295 and insert:

Section 6. Subsection (12) 395.1055, Florida Statutes, is renumbered as subsection (15), subsections (2) and (8) are amended, and a new subsections (12) and (13) are added to that section, to read:

395.1055 Rules and enforcement.

- (2) Separate standards may be provided for general and specialty hospitals, ambulatory surgical centers, recovery care centers, and statutory rural hospitals as defined in s. 395.602.
- (8) The agency may not adopt any rule governing the design, construction, erection, alteration, modification,

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repair, or demolition of any public or private hospital, intermediate residential treatment facility, recovery care center, or ambulatory surgical center. It is the intent of the Legislature to preempt that function to the Florida Building Commission and the State Fire Marshal through adoption and maintenance of the Florida Building Code and the Florida Fire Prevention Code. However, the agency shall provide technical assistance to the commission and the State Fire Marshal in updating the construction standards of the Florida Building Code and the Florida Fire Prevention Code which govern hospitals, intermediate residential treatment facilities, recovery care centers, and ambulatory surgical centers.

- (12) The agency shall adopt rules for recovery care centers which include fair and reasonable minimum standards for ensuring that recovery care centers have:
- (a) A dietetic department, service, or other similarly titled unit, either on the premises or under contract, which shall be organized, directed, and staffed to ensure the provision of appropriate nutritional care and quality food service.
- (b) Procedures to ensure the proper administration of medications. Such procedures shall address the prescribing, ordering, preparing, and dispensing of medications and appropriate monitoring of the effects of such medications on a patient.

- (13) The agency shall adopt rules that establish minimum standards for pediatric patient care in ambulatory surgical centers to ensure the safe and effective delivery of surgical care to children in ambulatory surgical centers. Such standards must include quality of care, nurse staffing, physician staffing, and equipment standards. Ambulatory surgical centers may not provide operative procedures to children younger than 18 years of age that require a length of stay past midnight until such standards are established by rule.
- (14) The agency shall adopt rules for food handling and food service standards for ambulatory surgical centers that provide advanced birth services or admit patients for overnight stay.
