6 Remove lines 258-295 and insert:

7 Section 6. Subsection (12) 395.1055, Florida Statutes, is
 8 renumbered as subsection (15), subsections (2) and (8) are
 9 amended, and a new subsections (12) and (13) are added to that
 10 section, to read:

11 395.1055 Rules and enforcement.—

12 (2) Separate standards may be provided for general and
 13 specialty hospitals, ambulatory surgical centers, recovery care
 14 centers, and statutory rural hospitals as defined in s. 395.602.

15 (8) The agency may not adopt any rule governing the
 16 design, construction, erection, alteration, modification,

17 repair, or demolition of any public or private hospital,
18 intermediate residential treatment facility, recovery care
19 center, or ambulatory surgical center. It is the intent of the
20 Legislature to preempt that function to the Florida Building
21 Commission and the State Fire Marshal through adoption and
22 maintenance of the Florida Building Code and the Florida Fire
23 Prevention Code. However, the agency shall provide technical
24 assistance to the commission and the State Fire Marshal in
25 updating the construction standards of the Florida Building Code
26 and the Florida Fire Prevention Code which govern hospitals,
27 intermediate residential treatment facilities, recovery care
28 centers, and ambulatory surgical centers.

29 (12) The agency shall adopt rules for recovery care
30 centers which include fair and reasonable minimum standards for
31 ensuring that recovery care centers have:

32 (a) A dietetic department, service, or other similarly
33 titled unit, either on the premises or under contract, which
34 shall be organized, directed, and staffed to ensure the
35 provision of appropriate nutritional care and quality food
36 service.

37 (b) Procedures to ensure the proper administration of
38 medications. Such procedures shall address the prescribing,
39 ordering, preparing, and dispensing of medications and
40 appropriate monitoring of the effects of such medications on a
41 patient.

42 (c) A pharmacy, pharmaceutical department, or
43 pharmaceutical service, or other similarly titled unit, on the
44 premises or under contract.

45 (13) The agency shall adopt rules that establish minimum
46 standards for pediatric patient care in ambulatory surgical
47 centers to ensure the safe and effective delivery of surgical
48 care to children in ambulatory surgical centers. Such standards
49 must include quality of care, nurse staffing, physician
50 staffing, and equipment standards. Ambulatory surgical centers
51 may not provide operative procedures to children younger than 18
52 years of age that require a length of stay past midnight until
53 such standards are established by rule.

54 (14) The agency shall adopt rules for food handling and
55 food service standards for ambulatory surgical centers that
56 provide advanced birth services or admit patients for overnight
57 stay.
