26	hospital's data for the quality measures and patient safety.

43	be completed annually by each hospital and ambulatory surgical	
44	center licensed under chapter 395. The survey shall be designed	
45	to measure aspects of patient safety culture, including	
46	frequency of adverse events, quality of handoffs and	
47	transitions, comfort in reporting a potential problem or error,	
48	the level of teamwork within hospital units and the facility as	
49	a whole, staff compliance with patient safety regulations and	
50	guidelines, staff perception of facility support for patient	
51	safety, and staff opinions on whether the staff member would	
52	undergo a health care service or procedure at the facility. The	
53	survey shall be anonymous to encourage staff employed by or	
54	working in the facility to complete the survey. The agency shall	
55	review and analyze nationally recognized patient safety culture	
56	survey products, including, but not limited to, the patient	
57	safety surveys developed by the federal Agency for Healthcare	
58	Research and Quality and the Safety Attitudes Questionnaire	
59	developed by the University of Texas, to develop the patient	
60	safety culture survey. This paragraph does not apply to licensed	
61	facilities operating exclusively as state facilities.	
62	<u>(k)</u> Conduct and make available the results of special	
63	health surveys, including facility patient safety culture	
64	surveys, health care research, and health care evaluations	
65	conducted or supported under this section. Each year the center	
66	shall select and analyze one or more research topics that can be	
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67 investigated using the data available pursuant to paragraph (c).
68 The selected topics must focus on producing actionable
69 information for improving quality of care and reducing costs.
70 The first topic selected by the center must address preventable

Section 3. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section
408.061, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

74 408.061 Data collection; uniform systems of financial 75 reporting; information relating to physician charges; 76 confidential information; immunity.-

77 The agency shall require the submission by health care (1)78 facilities, health care providers, and health insurers of data 79 necessary to carry out the agency's duties and to facilitate 80 transparency in health care pricing data and quality measures. Specifications for data to be collected under this section shall 81 82 be developed by the agency and applicable contract vendors, with 83 the assistance of technical advisory panels including representatives of affected entities, consumers, purchasers, and 84 85 such other interested parties as may be determined by the 86 agency.

(a) Data submitted by health care facilities, including
the facilities as defined in chapter 395, shall include, but are
not limited to: case-mix data, patient admission and discharge
data, hospital emergency department data which shall include the
number of patients treated in the emergency department of a

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92 licensed hospital reported by patient acuity level, data on 93 hospital-acquired infections as specified by rule, data on 94 complications as specified by rule, data on readmissions as 95 specified by rule, with patient and provider-specific 96 identifiers included, actual charge data by diagnostic groups or 97 other bundled groupings as specified by rule, facility patient safety culture surveys, financial data, accounting data, 98 operating expenses, expenses incurred for rendering services to 99 patients who cannot or do not pay, interest charges, 100 101 depreciation expenses based on the expected useful life of the 102 property and equipment involved, and demographic data. The 103 agency shall adopt nationally recognized risk adjustment 104 methodologies or software consistent with the standards of the 105 Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality and as selected by 106 the agency for all data submitted as required by this section. 107 Data may be obtained from documents such as, but not limited to: 108 leases, contracts, debt instruments, itemized patient statements or bills, medical record abstracts, and related diagnostic 109 110 information. Reported data elements shall be reported 111 electronically in accordance with rule 59E-7.012, Florida 112 Administrative Code. Data submitted shall be certified by the 113 chief executive officer or an appropriate and duly authorized representative or employee of the licensed facility that the 114 115 information submitted is true and accurate.

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116	Section 4. For the 2019-2020 fiscal year, one full-time
117	equivalent position with associated salary rate of 41,106 is
118	authorized, and the sum of \$352,919 in recurring funds from the
119	Health Care Trust Fund is appropriated to the Agency for Health
