20	Section 1. Subsections (3) and (4) are added to section
21	395.1012, Florida Statutes, to read:
22	395.1012 Patient safety
23	(3)(a) Each hospital shall provide to any patient upon
24	admission, upon scheduling of nonemergency care, or prior to
25	treatment written information on a form created by the agency

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26	that contains data reported for the most recent year available
27	for the hospital and the statewide average for the following
28	quality measures:
29	1. The rate of hospital-acquired infections;
30	2. The overall rating of the Hospital Consumer Assessment
31	of Healthcare Providers and Systems survey; and
32	3. The 15-day readmission rate.
33	(b) A hospital must also provide the written information
34	specified in paragraph (a) to any person upon request.
35	(c) The information required by this subsection must be
36	presented in a manner that is easily understandable and
37	accessible to the patient and must also include an explanation
38	of the quality measures and the relationship between the
39	hospital's data for the quality measures and patient safety.
40	(4) Each licensed facility subject to s. 408.05(3)(d)
41	shall submit facility patient safety culture surveys to the
42	agency in accordance with applicable rules.
43	Section 2. Paragraphs (d) through (k) of subsection (3) of
44	section 408.05, Florida Statutes, are redesignated as paragraphs
45	(e) through (l), respectively, present paragraph (j) is amended,

49	(3) HEALTH INFORMATION TRANSPARENCYIn order to
50	disseminate and facilitate the availability of comparable and
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51 uniform health information, the agency shall perform the 52 following functions: 53 Design a patient safety culture survey or surveys to (d) 54 be completed annually by each hospital and ambulatory surgical 55 center licensed under chapter 395. The survey shall be designed 56 to measure aspects of patient safety culture, including frequency of adverse events, quality of handoffs and 57 58 transitions, comfort in reporting a potential problem or error, 59 the level of teamwork within hospital units and the facility as 60 a whole, staff compliance with patient safety regulations and quidelines, staff perception of facility support for patient 61 62 safety, and staff opinions on whether the staff would undergo a 63 health care service or procedure at the facility. The survey 64 shall be anonymous to encourage staff employed by or working in 65 the facility to complete the survey. The agency shall review and 66 analyze nationally recognized patient safety culture survey 67 products, including, but not limited to, the patient safety surveys developed by the federal Agency for Healthcare Research 68 and Quality and the Safety Attitudes Questionnaire developed by 69 70 the University of Texas, to develop the patient safety culture 71 survey. This paragraph does not apply to licensed facilities 72 operating exclusively as state facilities. (k) (j) Conduct and make available the results of special 73 74 health surveys, including facility patient safety culture 75 surveys, health care research, and health care evaluations

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76 conducted or supported under this section. Each year the center 77 shall select and analyze one or more research topics that can be 78 investigated using the data available pursuant to paragraph (c). 79 The selected topics must focus on producing actionable 80 information for improving quality of care and reducing costs. 81 The first topic selected by the center must address preventable 82 hospitalizations.

83 Section 3. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section84 408.061, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

408.061 Data collection; uniform systems of financial reporting; information relating to physician charges; confidential information; immunity.-

88 The agency shall require the submission by health care (1)89 facilities, health care providers, and health insurers of data necessary to carry out the agency's duties and to facilitate 90 transparency in health care pricing data and quality measures. 91 92 Specifications for data to be collected under this section shall 93 be developed by the agency and applicable contract vendors, with 94 the assistance of technical advisory panels including 95 representatives of affected entities, consumers, purchasers, and 96 such other interested parties as may be determined by the 97 agency.

98 (a) Data submitted by health care facilities, including
99 the facilities as defined in chapter 395, shall include, but are
100 not limited to: case-mix data, patient admission and discharge

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101 data, hospital emergency department data which shall include the 102 number of patients treated in the emergency department of a 103 licensed hospital reported by patient acuity level, data on 104 hospital-acquired infections as specified by rule, data on 105 complications as specified by rule, data on readmissions as 106 specified by rule, with patient and provider-specific 107 identifiers included, actual charge data by diagnostic groups or 108 other bundled groupings as specified by rule, facility patient safety culture surveys, financial data, accounting data, 109 operating expenses, expenses incurred for rendering services to 110 patients who cannot or do not pay, interest charges, 111 112 depreciation expenses based on the expected useful life of the property and equipment involved, and demographic data. The 113 114 agency shall adopt nationally recognized risk adjustment 115 methodologies or software consistent with the standards of the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality and as selected by 116 117 the agency for all data submitted as required by this section. 118 Data may be obtained from documents such as, but not limited to: 119 leases, contracts, debt instruments, itemized patient statements or bills, medical record abstracts, and related diagnostic 120 121 information. Reported data elements shall be reported 122 electronically in accordance with rule 59E-7.012, Florida Administrative Code. Data submitted shall be certified by the 123 124 chief executive officer or an appropriate and duly authorized 125 representative or employee of the licensed facility that the

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126	information submitted is true and accurate.
127	Section 4. For the 2019-2020 fiscal year, one full-time
128	equivalent position with associated salary rate of 41,106 is
129	authorized, and the sum of \$352,919 in recurring funds from the
130	Health Care Trust Fund is appropriated to the Agency for Health
131	Care Administration, for the purpose of implementing the
132	requirements of this act.
133	Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 2019.

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
