It is the intent of the State of Florida to provide educational opportunities for its residents young people so that they can be trained for trades, occupations, and professions suited to their abilities. It is the intent of this act to promote the mode of training known as apprenticeship in occupations throughout industry in the state that require physical manipulative skills. By broadening job training opportunities and providing for increased coordination between public school academic programs, career programs, and registered apprenticeship programs, the residents of this young people of the state will benefit from the valuable training opportunities developed when on-the-job training is combined with academicrelated classroom experiences. This act is intended to develop the apparent potentials in apprenticeship training by assisting in the establishment of preapprenticeship programs in the public school system and elsewhere and by expanding presently registered programs as well as promoting new registered programs in jobs that lend themselves to apprenticeship training.

Section 2. Present subsection (2) of section 446.032, Florida Statutes, is renumbered as subsection (4), and new subsections (2) and (3) are added to that section, to read:

446.032 General duties of the department for apprenticeship training.—The department shall:

Section 4. Subsection (1) of section 446.051, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

446.051 Related instruction for apprentices.-

(1) The administration and supervision of related and supplemental instruction for apprentices, coordination of such instruction with job experiences, and selection and training of teachers and coordinators for such instruction, all as approved by the registered program sponsor, shall be the responsibility of the appropriate career education institution. However, if the registered program sponsor has received a grant award from the Florida Apprenticeship Grant Program, the department shall assume such responsibility.

Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 2019.
