- (a) A psychologist licensed under this chapter who applies for prescriptive authority certification shall provide, through an official transcript or other official document deemed

An organized sequence of study in a program offering intensive didactic education consistent with established policies of the American Psychological Association for education of psychologists in preparation for prescriptive authority. The program shall include coursework in the specific areas of basic sciences, neurosciences, physical examination, interpretation of laboratory tests, pathological basis of disease, clinical medicine, clinical neurotherapeutics, systems of care, pharmacology, clinical pharmacology, psychopharmacology, psychopharmacology research, and professional, ethical, and legal issues. The program must consist of an appropriate number of hours of didactic instruction, as determined by the board, to ensure the knowledge and skills required to prescribe drugs in a safe and effective manner.
- b. Relevant clinical experience sufficient to attain competency in the psychopharmacological treatment of a diverse patient population consistent with established policies of the

- (8) INTERIM PANEL.—The board shall establish an interim panel by October 1, 2019, to provide recommendations for proposed rules governing prescriptive authority for psychologists.
