4 Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert:

5 Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subsection (3) of section
6 320.06, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

7 320.06 Registration certificates, license plates, and
8 validation stickers generally.—

9 (3) (a) Registration license plates must be made of metal
10 specially treated with a retroreflection material, as specified
11 by the department. The registration license plate is designed to
12 increase nighttime visibility and legibility and must be at
13 least 6 inches wide and not less than 12 inches in length,

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14 unless a plate with reduced dimensions is deemed necessary by
15 the department to accommodate motorcycles, mopeds, or similar
16 smaller vehicles. Validation stickers must also be treated with
17 a retroreflection material, must be of such size as specified by
18 the department, and must adhere to the license plate. The
19 registration license plate must be imprinted with a combination
20 of bold letters and numerals or numerals, not to exceed seven
21 digits, to identify the registration license plate number. The
22 license plate must be imprinted with the word "Florida" at the
23 top and the name of the county in which it is sold, the state
24 motto, or the words "Sunshine State" at the bottom. Apportioned
25 license plates must have the word "Apportioned" at the bottom
26 and license plates issued for vehicles taxed under s.
27 320.08(3)(d), (4)(m) or (n), (5)(b) or (c), or (14) must have
28 the word "Restricted" at the bottom. License plates issued for
29 vehicles taxed under s. 320.08(12) must be imprinted with the
30 word "Florida" at the top and the word "Dealer" at the bottom
31 unless the license plate is a specialty license plate as
32 authorized in s. 320.08056. Manufacturer license plates issued
33 for vehicles taxed under s. 320.08(12) must be imprinted with
34 the word "Florida" at the top and the word "Manufacturer" at the
35 bottom. License plates issued for vehicles taxed under s.
36 320.08(5)(d) or (e) must be imprinted with the word "Wrecker" at
37 the bottom. Any county may, upon majority vote of the county
38 commission, elect to have the county name removed from the

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39 license plates sold in that county. The state motto or the words
40 "Sunshine State" shall be printed in lieu thereof. A license
41 plate issued for a vehicle taxed under s. 320.08(6) may not be
42 assigned a registration license number, or be issued with any
43 other distinctive character or designation, that distinguishes
44 the motor vehicle as a for-hire motor vehicle.

45 Section 2. Paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section
46 320.0657, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

47 320.0657 Permanent registration; fleet license plates.—

49 (b) The plates, which shall be of a distinctive color,
50 shall have the word "Fleet" appearing at the bottom and the word
51 "Florida" appearing at the top unless the license plate is a
52 specialty license plate as authorized in s. 320.08056. The
53 plates shall conform in all respects to the provisions of this
54 chapter, except as specified herein. For additional fees as set
55 forth in s. 320.08056, fleet companies may purchase specialty
56 license plates in lieu of the standard fleet license plates.
57 Fleet companies shall be responsible for all costs associated
58 with the specialty license plate, including all annual use fees,
59 processing fees, fees associated with switching license plate
60 types, and any other applicable fees.

61 Section 3. Subsection (12) of section 320.08, Florida
62 Statutes, is amended to read:

63 320.08 License taxes.—Except as otherwise provided herein,

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64 there are hereby levied and imposed annual license taxes for the
65 operation of motor vehicles, mopeds, motorized bicycles as
66 defined in s. 316.003(4), tri-vehicles as defined in s. 316.003,
67 and mobile homes as defined in s. 320.01, which shall be paid to
68 and collected by the department or its agent upon the
69 registration or renewal of registration of the following:

70 (12) DEALER AND MANUFACTURER LICENSE PLATES.—A franchised
71 motor vehicle dealer, independent motor vehicle dealer, marine
72 boat trailer dealer, or mobile home dealer and manufacturer
73 license plate: \$17 flat, of which \$4.50 shall be deposited into
74 the General Revenue Fund. For additional fees as set forth in s.
75 320.08056, dealers may purchase specialty license plates in lieu
76 of the standard graphic dealer license plates. Dealers shall be
77 responsible for all costs associated with the specialty license
78 plate, including all annual use fees, processing fees, fees
79 associated with switching license plate types, and any other
80 applicable fees.

81 Section 4. Section 320.08053, Florida Statutes, is amended
82 to read:

83 320.08053 Establishment of Requirements for requests to
84 establish specialty license plates.—

85 (1) If a specialty license plate requested by an
86 organization is approved by law, the organization must submit
87 the proposed art design for the specialty license plate to the
88 department, in a medium prescribed by the department, as soon as

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89 practicable, but no later than 60 days after the act approving
90 the specialty license plate becomes a law.

91 (2) (a) Within 120 days after ~~following~~ the specialty
92 license plate becomes ~~becoming~~ law, the department shall
93 establish a method to issue a specialty license plate voucher to
94 allow for the presale of the specialty license plate. The
95 processing fee as prescribed in s. 320.08056, the service charge
96 and branch fee as prescribed in s. 320.04, and the annual use
97 fee as prescribed in s. 320.08056 shall be charged for the
98 voucher. All other applicable fees shall be charged at the time
99 of issuance of the license plates.

100 (b) Within 24 months after the presale specialty license
101 plate voucher is established, the approved specialty license
102 plate organization must record with the department a minimum of
103 3,000 ~~1,000~~ voucher sales, or in the case of an out-of-state
104 college or university license plate, 4,000 voucher sales, before
105 manufacture of the license plate may commence. If, at the
106 conclusion of the 24-month presale period, the minimum sales
107 requirement has ~~requirements have~~ not been met, the specialty
108 plate is deauthorized and the department shall discontinue
109 development of the plate and discontinue issuance of the presale
110 vouchers. Upon deauthorization of the license plate, a purchaser
111 of the license plate voucher may use the annual use fee
112 collected as a credit towards any other specialty license plate
113 or apply for a refund on a form prescribed by the department.

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114 (3) (a) New specialty license plates that have been
115 approved by law but are awaiting issuance under paragraph (b)
116 shall be issued in the order they appear in s. 320.08056(4)
117 provided that they have met the presale requirement. All other
118 provisions of this section must also be met before a specialty
119 license plate may be issued. If the next awaiting specialty
120 license plate has not met the presale requirement, the
121 department shall proceed in the order provided in s.
122 320.08056(4) to identify the next qualified specialty license
123 plate that has met the presale requirement. The department shall
124 cycle through the list in statutory order.

125 (b) If the Legislature has approved 125 or more specialty
126 license plates, the department may not make any new specialty
127 license plates available for design or issuance until a
128 sufficient number of plates are discontinued pursuant to s.
129 320.08056(8) such that the number of plates being issued does
130 not exceed 125. Notwithstanding s. 320.08056(8) (a), the 125-
131 license-plate limit includes license plates above the minimum
132 sales threshold and those exempt from that threshold.

133 Section 5. Subsection (12) of section 320.08056, Florida
134 Statutes, is renumbered as subsection (13), subsections (2) and
135 (4), paragraph (a) of subsection (10), and subsection (11) are
136 amended, paragraphs (c) through (f) are added to subsection (8),
137 and a new subsection (12) is added to that section, to read:

138 320.08056 Specialty license plates.—

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139 (2) (a) The department shall issue a specialty license
140 plate to the owner or lessee of any motor vehicle, except a
141 vehicle registered under the International Registration Plan, a
142 commercial truck required to display two license plates pursuant
143 to s. 320.0706, or a truck tractor, upon request and payment of
144 the appropriate license tax and fees.

145 (b) The department may authorize dealer and fleet
146 specialty license plates. With the permission of the sponsoring
147 specialty license plate organization, a dealer or fleet company
148 may purchase specialty license plates to be used on dealer and
149 fleet vehicles.

150 (c) Notwithstanding s. 320.08058, a dealer or fleet
151 specialty license plate must include the letters "DLR" or "FLT"
152 on the right side of the license plate. Dealer and fleet
153 specialty license plates must be ordered directly from the
154 department.

155 (4) The following license plate annual use fees shall be

251 (c) A vehicle owner or lessee issued a specialty license
252 plate that has been discontinued by the department may keep the
253 discontinued specialty license plate for the remainder of the
254 10-year license plate replacement period and must pay all other
255 applicable registration fees. However, such owner or lessee is
256 exempt from paying the applicable specialty license plate annual
257 use fee under subsection (4) for the remainder of the 10-year
258 license plate replacement period.

259 (d) If the department discontinues issuance of a specialty
260 license plate, all annual use fees held or collected by the
261 department shall be distributed within 180 days after the date
262 the specialty license plate is discontinued. Of those fees, the
263 department shall retain an amount sufficient to defray the

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264 applicable administrative and inventory closeout costs
265 associated with discontinuance of the plate. All remaining
266 proceeds shall be distributed to the appropriate organization or
267 organizations pursuant to s. 320.08058.

268 (e) If an organization that is the intended recipient of
269 the funds pursuant to s. 320.08058 no longer exists, the
270 department shall deposit any undisbursed proceeds into the
271 Highway Safety Operating Trust Fund.

272 (f) Notwithstanding paragraph (a), on January 1 of each
273 year, the department shall discontinue the specialty license
274 plate with the fewest number of plates in circulation, including
275 license plates exempt from a statutory sales requirement. The
276 department shall mail a warning letter to the sponsoring
277 organizations of the 10 percent of specialty license plates with
278 the lowest number of valid, active registrations as of December
279 1 of each year.

280 (10) (a) A specialty license plate annual use fee collected
281 and distributed under this chapter, or any interest earned from
282 those fees, may not be used for commercial or for-profit
283 activities nor for general or administrative expenses, except as
284 authorized by s. 320.08058 or to pay the cost of the audit or
285 report required by s. 320.08062(1). The fees and any interest
286 earned from the fees may be expended only for use in this state
287 unless the annual use fee is derived from the sale of United
288 States Armed Forces and veterans-related specialty license

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289 plates pursuant to paragraph (3) (d) for the Support Our Troops
290 and American Legion license plates; paragraphs (4) (b), (q), and
291 (v) for the Florida Salutes Veterans, United States Marine
292 Corps, and Military Services license plates, respectively;
293 paragraphs (4) (z), (aa), and (bb) for out-of-state college or
294 university license plates; paragraphs (4) (d), (bb), (ll), (kkk),
295 and (yyy) and s. 320.0891 for the U.S. Paratrooper license
296 plate.

297 (11) The annual use fee from the sale of specialty license
298 plates, the interest earned from those fees, or any fees
299 received by any entity ~~an agency~~ as a result of the sale of
300 specialty license plates may not be used for the purpose of
301 marketing to, or lobbying, entertaining, or rewarding, an
302 employee of a governmental agency that is responsible for the
303 sale and distribution of specialty license plates, or an elected
304 member or employee of the Legislature.

305 (12) For out-of-state college or university license plates
306 created pursuant to this section, the recipient organization
307 shall:

308 (a) Have established an endowment, based in this state,
309 for the purpose of providing scholarships to Florida residents
310 meeting the statutory requirements for that license plate.

311 (b) Provide documentation acceptable to the department
312 that the organization and the department have the college's or
313 university's consent to use an appropriate image on a license

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314 plate.

315 Section 6. Effective July 1, 2022, paragraph (a) of
316 subsection (8) of section 320.08056, Florida Statutes, is
317 amended to read:

318 320.08056 Specialty license plates.—

319 (8) (a) The department must discontinue the issuance of an
320 approved specialty license plate if the number of valid
321 specialty plate registrations falls below 3,000, or in the case
322 of an out-of-state college or university license plate, 4,000,
323 1,000 plates for at least 12 consecutive months. The department
324 shall mail a warning letter ~~shall be mailed~~ to the sponsoring
325 organization following the first month in which the total number
326 of valid specialty plate registrations is below 3,000, or in the
327 case of an out-of-state college or university license plate,
328 4,000, 1,000 plates. This paragraph does not apply to in-state
329 collegiate license plates established under s. 320.08058(3),
330 license plates of institutions in and entities of the State
331 University System, specialty license plates that have statutory
332 eligibility limitations for purchase, specialty license plates
333 for which annual use fees are distributed by a foundation for
334 student and teacher leadership programs and teacher recruitment
335 and retention, or Florida Professional Sports Team license

348 (a) Special Olympics Florida license plates must contain
349 the official Special Olympics Florida logo and must bear the
350 colors and a design and colors that are approved by the

352 ~~bottom~~ of the plate, and the words "Be a Fan" "~~Everyone Wins~~"
353 must be centered at the bottom ~~top~~ of the plate.

355 ~~(a) Notwithstanding the provisions of s. 320.08053, the~~
356 ~~department shall develop an American Red Cross license plate as~~

358 ~~top of the plate, and the words "American Red Cross" must appear~~
359 ~~at the bottom of the plate.~~

360 ~~(b) The department shall retain all revenues from the sale~~
361 ~~of such plates until all startup costs for developing and~~
362 ~~issuing the plates have been recovered. Thereafter, 50 percent~~
363 ~~of the annual use fees shall be distributed to the American Red~~

375 (b) The department shall distribute the Florida Golf
376 license plate annual use fee to the Dade Amateur Golf
377 Association, a nonprofit organization under s. 501(c)(3) of the
378 Internal Revenue Code. The license plate annual use fees are to
379 be annually allocated as follows:

380 1. Up to 15 percent of the proceeds from the annual use
381 fees may be used by the Dade Amateur Golf Association for the
382 administration of the Florida Junior Golf Program.

383 2. The Dade Amateur Golf Association shall receive the
384 first \$80,000 in proceeds from the annual use fees for the
385 operation of youth golf programs in Miami-Dade County.
386 Thereafter, 30 ~~15~~ percent of the proceeds from the annual use
387 fees shall be provided to the Dade Amateur Golf Association for
388 the operation of youth golf programs in Miami-Dade County,

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389 including expenditures necessary to comply with the Americans

399 (a) The department shall develop a Live the Dream license
400 plate as provided in this section. Live the Dream license plates
401 must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The
402 word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the
403 words "Live the Dream" must appear at the bottom of the plate.

404 (b) The proceeds of the annual use fee shall be
405 distributed to the Dream Foundation, Inc., ~~to The Dream~~
406 ~~Foundation, Inc., shall retain the first \$60,000 in proceeds~~
407 ~~from the annual use fees as reimbursement for administrative~~
408 ~~costs, startup costs, and costs incurred in the approval~~
409 ~~process. Thereafter, up to 25 percent shall be used for~~

425 ~~Association of Healthy Start Coalitions to decrease racial~~

427 ~~outcomes. Funding will be used by local Healthy Start Coalitions~~
428 ~~to provide services and increase screening rates for high-risk~~
429 ~~pregnant women, children under 4 years of age, and women of~~

431 ~~3.4. At least 30 Ten~~ percent shall be distributed to
432 Chapman the Community Partnership for Homeless, Inc., for
433 programs that provide relief from poverty, hunger, and
434 homelessness.

435 4. Up to 5 percent may be distributed by the department on
436 behalf of The Dream Foundation, Inc., to The Martin Luther King,
437 Jr. Center for Nonviolent Social Change, Inc., as a royalty for
438 the use of the image of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

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439 ~~5. Five percent of the proceeds shall be used by the~~
440 ~~foundation for administrative costs directly associated with~~
