70 Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subsection (3) of section
71 320.06, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

72 320.06 Registration certificates, license plates, and
73 validation stickers generally.—

74 (3) (a) Registration license plates must be made of metal
75 specially treated with a retroreflection material, as specified

76 | by the department. The registration license plate is designed to
77 | increase nighttime visibility and legibility and must be at
78 | least 6 inches wide and not less than 12 inches in length,
79 | unless a plate with reduced dimensions is deemed necessary by
80 | the department to accommodate motorcycles, mopeds, or similar
81 | smaller vehicles. Validation stickers must also be treated with
82 | a retroreflection material, must be of such size as specified by
83 | the department, and must adhere to the license plate. The
84 | registration license plate must be imprinted with a combination
85 | of bold letters and numerals or numerals, not to exceed seven
86 | digits, to identify the registration license plate number. The
87 | license plate must be imprinted with the word "Florida" at the
88 | top and the name of the county in which it is sold, the state
89 | motto, or the words "Sunshine State" at the bottom. Apportioned
90 | license plates must have the word "Apportioned" at the bottom
91 | and license plates issued for vehicles taxed under s.
92 | 320.08(3)(d), (4)(m) or (n), (5)(b) or (c), or (14) must have
93 | the word "Restricted" at the bottom. License plates issued for
94 | vehicles taxed under s. 320.08(12) must be imprinted with the
95 | word "Florida" at the top and the word "Dealer" at the bottom
96 | unless the license plate is a specialty license plate as
97 | authorized in s. 320.08056. Manufacturer license plates issued
98 | for vehicles taxed under s. 320.08(12) must be imprinted with
99 | the word "Florida" at the top and the word "Manufacturer" at the
100 | bottom. License plates issued for vehicles taxed under s.

101 320.08(5)(d) or (e) must be imprinted with the word "Wrecker" at
102 the bottom. Any county may, upon majority vote of the county
103 commission, elect to have the county name removed from the
104 license plates sold in that county. The state motto or the words
105 "Sunshine State" shall be printed in lieu thereof. A license
106 plate issued for a vehicle taxed under s. 320.08(6) may not be
107 assigned a registration license number, or be issued with any
108 other distinctive character or designation, that distinguishes
109 the motor vehicle as a for-hire motor vehicle.

110 Section 2. Paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section
111 320.0657, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

112 320.0657 Permanent registration; fleet license plates.—

114 (b) The plates, which shall be of a distinctive color,
115 shall have the word "Fleet" appearing at the bottom and the word
116 "Florida" appearing at the top unless the license plate is a
117 specialty license plate as authorized in s. 320.08056. The
118 plates shall conform in all respects to the provisions of this
119 chapter, except as specified herein. For additional fees as set
120 forth in s. 320.08056, fleet companies may purchase specialty
121 license plates in lieu of the standard fleet license plates.
122 Fleet companies shall be responsible for all costs associated
123 with the specialty license plate, including all annual use fees,
124 processing fees, fees associated with switching license plate
125 types, and any other applicable fees.

126 Section 3. Subsection (12) of section 320.08, Florida
 127 Statutes, is amended to read:

128 320.08 License taxes.—Except as otherwise provided herein,
 129 there are hereby levied and imposed annual license taxes for the
 130 operation of motor vehicles, mopeds, motorized bicycles as
 131 defined in s. 316.003(4), tri-vehicles as defined in s. 316.003,
 132 and mobile homes as defined in s. 320.01, which shall be paid to
 133 and collected by the department or its agent upon the
 134 registration or renewal of registration of the following:

135 (12) DEALER AND MANUFACTURER LICENSE PLATES.—A franchised
 136 motor vehicle dealer, independent motor vehicle dealer, marine
 137 boat trailer dealer, or mobile home dealer and manufacturer
 138 license plate: \$17 flat, of which \$4.50 shall be deposited into
 139 the General Revenue Fund. For additional fees as set forth in s.
 140 320.08056, dealers may purchase specialty license plates in lieu
 141 of the standard graphic dealer license plates. Dealers shall be
 142 responsible for all costs associated with the specialty license
 143 plate, including all annual use fees, processing fees, fees
 144 associated with switching license plate types, and any other
 145 applicable fees.

146 Section 4. Section 320.08053, Florida Statutes, is amended
 147 to read:

148 320.08053 Establishment of Requirements for requests to
 149 ~~establish~~ specialty license plates.—

150 (1) If a specialty license plate requested by an

151 organization is approved by law, the organization must submit
 152 the proposed art design for the specialty license plate to the
 153 department, in a medium prescribed by the department, as soon as
 154 practicable, but no later than 60 days after the act approving
 155 the specialty license plate becomes a law.

156 (2) (a) Within 120 days after ~~following~~ the specialty
 157 license plate becomes ~~becoming~~ law, the department shall
 158 establish a method to issue a specialty license plate voucher to
 159 allow for the presale of the specialty license plate. The
 160 processing fee as prescribed in s. 320.08056, the service charge
 161 and branch fee as prescribed in s. 320.04, and the annual use
 162 fee as prescribed in s. 320.08056 shall be charged for the
 163 voucher. All other applicable fees shall be charged at the time
 164 of issuance of the license plates.

165 (b) Within 24 months after the presale specialty license
 166 plate voucher is established, the approved specialty license
 167 plate organization must record with the department a minimum of
 168 3,000 ~~1,000~~ voucher sales, or in the case of an out-of-state
 169 college or university license plate, 4,000 voucher sales, before
 170 manufacture of the license plate may commence. If, at the
 171 conclusion of the 24-month presale period, the minimum sales
 172 requirement has ~~requirements have~~ not been met, the specialty
 173 plate is deauthorized and the department shall discontinue
 174 development of the plate and discontinue issuance of the presale
 175 vouchers. Upon deauthorization of the license plate, a purchaser

176 of the license plate voucher may use the annual use fee
177 collected as a credit towards any other specialty license plate
178 or apply for a refund on a form prescribed by the department.

179 (3) (a) New specialty license plates that have been
180 approved by law but are awaiting issuance under paragraph (b)
181 shall be issued in the order they appear in s. 320.08056(4)
182 provided that they have met the presale requirement. All other
183 provisions of this section must also be met before a specialty
184 license plate may be issued. If the next awaiting specialty
185 license plate has not met the presale requirement, the
186 department shall proceed in the order provided in s.
187 320.08056(4) to identify the next qualified specialty license
188 plate that has met the presale requirement. The department shall
189 cycle through the list in statutory order.

190 (b) If the Legislature has approved 125 or more specialty
191 license plates, the department may not make any new specialty
192 license plates available for design or issuance until a
193 sufficient number of plates are discontinued pursuant to s.
194 320.08056(8) such that the number of plates being issued does
195 not exceed 125. Notwithstanding s. 320.08056(8) (a), the 125-
196 license-plate limit includes license plates above the minimum
197 sales threshold and those exempt from that threshold.

204 (2) (a) The department shall issue a specialty license
 205 plate to the owner or lessee of any motor vehicle, except a
 206 vehicle registered under the International Registration Plan, a
 207 commercial truck required to display two license plates pursuant
 208 to s. 320.0706, or a truck tractor, upon request and payment of
 209 the appropriate license tax and fees.

210 (b) The department may authorize dealer and fleet
 211 specialty license plates. With the permission of the sponsoring
 212 specialty license plate organization, a dealer or fleet company
 213 may purchase specialty license plates to be used on dealer and
 214 fleet vehicles.

215 (c) Notwithstanding s. 320.08058, a dealer or fleet
 216 specialty license plate must include the letters "DLR" or "FLT"
 217 on the right side of the license plate. Dealer and fleet
 218 specialty license plates must be ordered directly from the
 219 department.

316 (c) A vehicle owner or lessee issued a specialty license
 317 plate that has been discontinued by the department may keep the
 318 discontinued specialty license plate for the remainder of the
 319 10-year license plate replacement period and must pay all other
 320 applicable registration fees. However, such owner or lessee is
 321 exempt from paying the applicable specialty license plate annual
 322 use fee under subsection (4) for the remainder of the 10-year
 323 license plate replacement period.

324 (d) If the department discontinues issuance of a specialty
 325 license plate, all annual use fees held or collected by the

326 department shall be distributed within 180 days after the date
327 the specialty license plate is discontinued. Of those fees, the
328 department shall retain an amount sufficient to defray the
329 applicable administrative and inventory closeout costs
330 associated with discontinuance of the plate. All remaining
331 proceeds shall be distributed to the appropriate organization or
332 organizations pursuant to s. 320.08058.

333 (e) If an organization that is the intended recipient of
334 the funds pursuant to s. 320.08058 no longer exists, the
335 department shall deposit any undisbursed proceeds into the
336 Highway Safety Operating Trust Fund.

337 (f) Notwithstanding paragraph (a), on January 1 of each
338 year, the department shall discontinue the specialty license
339 plate with the fewest number of plates in circulation, including
340 license plates exempt from a statutory sales requirement. The
341 department shall mail a warning letter to the sponsoring
342 organizations of the 10 percent of specialty license plates with
343 the lowest number of valid, active registrations as of December
344 1 of each year.

345 (10) (a) A specialty license plate annual use fee collected
346 and distributed under this chapter, or any interest earned from
347 those fees, may not be used for commercial or for-profit
348 activities nor for general or administrative expenses, except as
349 authorized by s. 320.08058 or to pay the cost of the audit or
350 report required by s. 320.08062(1). The fees and any interest

351 | earned from the fees may be expended only for use in this state
 352 | unless the annual use fee is derived from the sale of United

362 | (11) The annual use fee from the sale of specialty license
 363 | plates, the interest earned from those fees, or any fees

 366 | marketing to, or lobbying, entertaining, or rewarding, an
 367 | employee of a governmental agency that is responsible for the

391 of valid specialty plate registrations is below 3,000, or in the
