15	Section 1. Section 110.1226, Florida Statutes, is created

17	110.1226 Florida emergency moratorium on repayment of
18	debts for furloughed employees
19	(1) SHORT TITLE This act may be cited as the "Florida
20	Emergency Moratorium on Repayment of Debts for Furloughed
21	Employees Act."
22	(2) LEGISLATIVE INTENTIt is the intent of the
23	Legislature to support all local, state, and federal government
24	employees living and working in the state, and if such
25	government employees are furloughed or suspended from work

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26	because of a government closure or shutdown, the state will
27	assist those employees during the closure or shutdown and upon
28	the reopening of the government.
29	(3) DEFINITIONSFor purposes of this section, the term:
30	(a) "Department" means the Department of Economic
31	Opportunity.
32	(b) "Government employee" or "employee" means any person
33	employed by a local, state, or federal government agency or
34	entity.
35	(4) EMERGENCY MORATORIUM.
36	(a) In the event of a local, state, or federal government
37	closure or shutdown, the agency or entity that is closed or shut
38	down shall notify, in writing, all affected government
39	employees. Upon notification, an affected government employee
40	may contact the department and request, in writing, assistance
41	from the department.
42	(b) The department shall, upon verification that the
43	affected government employee is furloughed, provide such
44	employee a Letter to Creditors, which the employee must mail to
45	his or her creditors individually, requesting certain creditors,
46	including, but not limited to, utility companies, landlords, and
47	mortgage companies, to comply with the State of Florida
48	Emergency Moratorium on Repayment of Debts for Furloughed
49	Employees Act by stopping all collection of debts owed by the
50	affected government employee. The moratorium shall last no
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51 longer than 6 months after the mailing date of the Letter to 52 Creditors. 53 (c) Any creditor that receives a Letter to Creditors may 54 not adversely report the government employee to a collection 55 agency or credit reporting bureau. A government employee's 56 credit worthiness may not be affected during the time the 57 employee is furloughed. 58 (d) Upon the reopening of the government agency or entity, 59 or the expiration of the 6-month period, whichever is sooner, 60 the moratorium is lifted and credit reporting may resume. The affected government employee may request assistance from the 61 62 department to create a repayment plan unless the state decides to pay, cancel, or suspend any or all of the employee's debt. 63 64 (5) The department shall adopt rules to implement this 65 section. 66 (6) This section applies to government employees 67 furloughed on or after December 22, 2018. 68 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2019.

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
