(a) Be at least 18 years of age.

(b) File an affidavit that the applicant subscribes to and will uphold the principles incorporated in the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the State of Florida and that the information provided in the application is true, accurate, and complete. The affidavit shall be by original signature or by electronic authentication. The affidavit shall include substantially the following warning:

WARNING: Giving false information in order to obtain or renew a Florida educator's certificate is a criminal offense under Florida law. Anyone giving false information on this affidavit is subject to criminal prosecution as well as disciplinary action by the Education Practices Commission.

6 (c) Document receipt of a bachelor's or higher degree from 7 an accredited institution of higher learning, or a nonaccredited 8 institution of higher learning that the Department of Education 9 has identified as having a quality program resulting in a 0 bachelor's degree, or higher. Each applicant seeking initial 1 certification must have attained at least a 2.5 overall grade 2 point average on a 4.0 scale in the applicant's major field of 3 study. The applicant may document the required education by 4 submitting official transcripts from institutions of higher 5 education or by authorizing the direct submission of such 6 official transcripts through established electronic network 7 systems. The bachelor's or higher degree may not be required in 8 areas approved in rule by the State Board of Education as 9 nondegreed areas. The State Board of Education may adopt rules 0 that, for purposes of demonstrating completion of specific

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certification requirements, allow for the acceptance of college 41 42 course credits recommended by the American Council for Education 43 (ACE), as posted on an official ACE transcript.

44 (d) Submit to background screening in accordance with subsection (10). If the background screening indicates a 45 46 criminal history or if the applicant acknowledges a criminal 47 history, the applicant's records shall be referred to the investigative section in the Department of Education for review 48 and determination of eligibility for certification. If the 49 50 applicant fails to provide the necessary documentation requested 51 by the department within 90 days after the date of the receipt of the certified mail request, the statement of eligibility and 52 53 pending application shall become invalid.

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(e) Be of good moral character.

(f) Be competent and capable of performing the duties, functions, and responsibilities of an educator.

(q) Demonstrate mastery of general knowledge, pursuant to subsection (3), if the person serves as a classroom teacher pursuant to s. 1012.01(2)(a).

(h) Demonstrate mastery of subject area knowledge, pursuant to subsection (5).

(i) Demonstrate mastery of professional preparation and education competence, pursuant to subsection (6).

(3) MASTERY OF GENERAL KNOWLEDGE.-Acceptable means of demonstrating mastery of general knowledge are:

(a) Achievement of passing scores on the general knowledge 67 examination required by state board rule;

(b) Documentation of a valid professional standard teaching certificate issued by another state;

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70 (c) Documentation of a valid certificate issued by the 71 National Board for Professional Teaching Standards or a national 72 educator credentialing board approved by the State Board of 73 Education:

(d) Documentation of two semesters of successful, full-time 75 or part-time teaching in a Florida College System institution, 76 state university, or private college or university that awards an associate or higher degree and is an accredited institution or an institution of higher education identified by the 79 Department of Education as having a quality program; or

80 (e) Effective July 1, 2015, Achievement of passing scores, 81 identified in state board rule, on national or international 82 examinations that test comparable content and relevant standards 83 in verbal, analytical writing, and quantitative reasoning 84 skills, including, but not limited to, the verbal, analytical 85 writing, and quantitative reasoning portions of the Graduate 86 Record Examination. Passing scores identified in state board 87 rule must be at approximately the same level of rigor as is 88 required to pass the general knowledge examinations.

90 A school district that employs an individual who does not 91 achieve passing scores on any subtest of the general knowledge 92 examination must provide information regarding the availability 93 of state-level and district-level supports and instruction to assist him or her in achieving a passing score. Such information 94 95 must include, but need not be limited to, state-level test information guides, school district test preparation resources, 96 97 and preparation courses offered by state universities and Florida College System institutions. 98

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99 (7) TYPES AND TERMS OF CERTIFICATION.-100 (a) The Department of Education shall issue a professional 101 certificate for a period not to exceed 5 years to any applicant 102 who fulfills one of the following: 103 1. Meets all the applicable requirements outlined in 104 subsection (2). 105 2. For a professional certificate covering grades 6 through 12: 106 107 a. Meets the applicable requirements of paragraphs (2)(a)-108 (h). 109 b. Holds a master's or higher degree in the area of 110 science, technology, engineering, or mathematics. 111 c. Teaches a high school course in the subject of the 112 advanced degree. 113 d. Is rated highly effective as determined by the teacher's performance evaluation under s. 1012.34, based in part on 114 115 student performance as measured by a statewide, standardized 116 assessment or an Advanced Placement, Advanced International 117 Certificate of Education, or International Baccalaureate 118 examination. 119 e. Achieves a passing score on the Florida professional 120 education competency examination required by state board rule. 121 3. Meets the applicable requirements of paragraphs (2)(a)-122 (h) and completes a professional preparation and education 123 competence program approved by the department pursuant to 124 paragraph (8)(c). An applicant who completes the program and is 125 rated highly effective as determined by his or her performance 126 evaluation under s. 1012.34 is not required to take or achieve a 127 passing score on the professional education competency
