18	(3)(a) To be eligible for a <u>recruitment salary increase as</u>

20	1. A newly hired classroom teacher must be a content
21	expert, based on criteria established by the department, in
22	mathematics, science, computer science, reading, or civics.
23	2. An instructional personnel staff member must be hired to
24	fill a designated critical shortage area or must voluntarily
25	switch fields to fill a critical shortage area scholarship in
26	the amount of \$6,000, a classroom teacher must:
27	1. Have achieved a composite score at or above the 80th
28	percentile on either the SAT or the ACT based on the National
29	Percentile Ranks in effect when the classroom teacher took the
30	assessment and have been evaluated as highly effective pursuant
31	to s. 1012.34 in the school year immediately preceding the year
32	in which the scholarship will be awarded, unless the classroom
33	teacher is newly hired by the district school board and has not
34	been evaluated pursuant to s. 1012.34.
35	2. Beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, have achieved
36	a composite score at or above the 77th percentile or, if the
37	classroom teacher graduated cum laude or higher with a
38	baccalaureate degree, the 71st percentile on either the SAT,
39	ACT, GRE, LSAT, GMAT, or MCAT based on the National Percentile
40	Ranks in effect when the classroom teacher took the assessment;

48	(b) To be eligible for a retention salary increase as
49	specified in the General Appropriations Act, a classroom teacher
50	or an instructional personnel staff member must have been rated
51	as highly effective or effective the preceding year pursuant to
52	s. 1012.34, and must teach or be employed in a school for 2
53	consecutive school years, including the current year, which has
54	improved an average of 3 percentage points or more in the
55	percentage of total possible points achieved for determining
56	school grades over the prior 3 years
57	1. In order to demonstrate eligibility for an award, an
58	eligible classroom teacher must submit to the school district,
59	no later than November 1, an official record of his or her
60	qualifying assessment score and, beginning with the 2020-2021
61	school year, an official transcript demonstrating that he or she
62	graduated cum laude or higher with a baccalaureate degree, if
63	applicable. Once a classroom teacher is deemed eligible by the
64	school district, the teacher shall remain eligible as long as he
65	or she remains employed by the school district as a classroom
66	teacher at the time of the award and receives an annual
67	performance evaluation rating of highly effective pursuant to s.
68	1012.34 or is evaluated as highly effective based on a
69	commissioner-approved student learning growth formula pursuant
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70	to s. 1012.34(8) for the 2019-2020 school year or thereafter.
71	2. A school district employee who is no longer a classroom
72	teacher may receive an award if the employee was a classroom
73	teacher in the prior school year, was rated highly effective,
74	and met the requirements of this section as a classroom teacher.
