- (e) Require eligible scholarship funding organizations to submit students determined to be eligible to the department on July 1, August 1, October 1, and January 1 of each year.
- (f) Notify eligible scholarship-funding organizations of students who are eligible for an initial scholarship award on a first-come, first-served basis, based upon the following order of priority:

- 2. A sibling of a student who is participating in the scholarship program under this subsection and resides in the same household as the sibling.
- PARTICIPATION.—A parent who applies for program participation under this section is exercising his or her parental option to determine the appropriate placement or the services that best meet the needs of his or her student.
- (a) The parent must select an eligible private school and apply for the admission of his or her student.
- (b) The parent must inform the student's school district when the parent withdraws his or her student to attend an eligible private school.
- (c) Any student participating in the scholarship program must remain in attendance at the private school throughout the school year unless excused by the school for illness or other good cause.
- (d) Each parent and each student has an obligation to the private school to comply with the private school's published policies.
- (e) The parent shall ensure that his or her student participating in the scholarship program takes the norm-

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referenced assessment offered by the private school. The parent
may also choose to have his or her student participate in the
statewide assessments pursuant to s. 1008.22. If the parent
requests that his or her student take statewide assessments
pursuant to s. 1008.22 and the private school has not chosen to
offer and administer the statewide assessments, the parent is
responsible for transporting the student to the assessment site
designated by the school district.

- (f) The parent may not receive a payment, refund, or rebate from a private school under this program. A parent who fails to comply with this subsection forfeits program participation.
- (10) OBLIGATIONS OF ELIGIBLE NONPROFIT SCHOLARSHIP-FUNDING
 ORGANIZATIONS.—An eligible nonprofit scholarship-funding
 organization may establish scholarships for eligible students
 by:
- (a) Receiving applications and determining student eligibility in accordance with the requirements of this section.
 - (b) Notifying parents of their receipt of a scholarship.
- (c) Establishing a date by which the parent of a participating student must confirm continuing participation in the program.
- (d) Awarding scholarship funds to eligible students in the following order of priority:
