(1) In order for a student to be promoted to high school from a school that includes middle grades 6, 7, and 8, the student must successfully complete the following courses:

30 Three middle grades or higher courses in social (C) studies. Beginning with students entering grade 6 in the 2012-31 32 2013 school year, One of these courses must be at least a one-33 semester civics education course that includes the roles and responsibilities of federal, state, and local governments; the 34 35 structures and functions of the legislative, executive, and 36 judicial branches of government; and the meaning and 37 significance of historic documents, such as the Articles of 38 Confederation, the Declaration of Independence, and the 39 Constitution of the United States. All instructional materials for the civics education course must be reviewed and approved by 40 41 the Commissioner of Education, in consultation with 42 organizations that may include, but are not limited to, the 43 Florida Joint Center for Citizenship, the Bill of Rights 44 Institute, Hillsdale College, the Gilder Lehrman Institute of 45 American History, iCivics, and the Constitutional Sources 46 Project, and with educators, school administrators, postsecondary education representatives, elected officials, 47 business and industry leaders, parents, and the public. Any 48 49 errors and inaccuracies the commissioner identifies in state-50 adopted materials must be corrected pursuant to s. 1006.35.

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51 After consulting with such entities and individuals, the 52 commissioner shall review the current state-approved civics 53 education course instructional materials and the test 54 specifications for the statewide, standardized EOC assessment in 55 civics education and shall make recommendations for improvements 56 to the materials and test specifications by December 31, 2019. 57 By December 31, 2020, the department shall complete a review of 58 the statewide civics education course standards. Beginning with the 2013-2014 school year, Each student's performance on the 59 60 statewide, standardized EOC assessment in civics education required under s. 1008.22 constitutes 30 percent of the 61 62 student's final course grade. A middle grades student who transfers into the state's public school system from out of 63 64 country, out of state, a private school, or a home education 65 program after the beginning of the second term of grade 8 is not 66 required to meet the civics education requirement for promotion 67 from the middle grades if the student's transcript documents 68 passage of three courses in social studies or two year-long 69 courses in social studies that include coverage of civics 70 education. 71 Section 2.
