If such vehicle is registered in the name of more than one person, the birth month of the person whose name first appears on the registration shall be used to determine the registration period. For a vehicle subject to this registration period, the renewal period is the 30-day period ending at midnight on the vehicle owner's date of birth.

In order to implement the changes made by this act to s. 320.055, Florida Statutes, the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles may develop and employ methods including, but not limited to, prorating registration fees for vehicles subject to registration under s. 320.08(4)(a) or (b), Florida Statutes, based on the number of months in the vehicle registration period. Proration is limited to the renewal of an unexpired registration or a registration that has been expired for no more than 30 days.

(7) A surviving spouse of a registered owner of any motor vehicle may, upon presenting the death certificate or death records maintained by the Department of Health and provided to a Florida tax collector, request a registration certificate and transfer of the registration license plate.

In making application for transfer of title from a deceased titled owner, the new owner or surviving coowner shall establish proof of ownership by submitting with the application the original certificate of title and the decedent's probated last will and testament or letters of administration appointing the personal representative of the decedent. In lieu of a probated last will and testament or letters of administration, a copy of the decedent's death certificate or death records maintained by the Department of Health and provided to a Florida tax collector, a copy of the decedent's last will and testament, and an affidavit by the decedent's surviving spouse or heirs affirming rights of ownership may be accepted by the department. If the decedent died intestate, a court order awarding the ownership of the vessel or an affidavit by the decedent's surviving spouse or heirs establishing or releasing all rights of ownership and a copy of the decedent's death certificate shall be submitted to the department.

Section 7. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2019.
