14	Section 2. Subsections (1) and (3) and paragraph (c) of
15	subsection (7) of section 316.2397, Florida Statutes, are
16	amended to read:
17	316.2397 Certain lights prohibited; exceptions
18	(1) <u>A</u> No person <u>may not</u> shall drive or move or cause to be
19	moved any vehicle or equipment upon any highway within this
20	state with any lamp or device thereon showing or displaying a
21	red, red and white, or blue light visible from directly in front
22	thereof except for certain vehicles hereinafter provided in this
23	section.
24	(3) Vehicles of the fire department and fire patrol,
25	including vehicles of volunteer firefighters as permitted under
26	s. 316.2398, may show or display red or red and white lights.
27	Vehicles of medical staff physicians or technicians of medical
28	facilities licensed by the state as authorized under s.
29	316.2398, ambulances as authorized under this chapter, and buses
30	and taxicabs as authorized under s. 316.2399 may show or display
31	red lights. Vehicles of the fire department, fire patrol, police
32	vehicles, and such ambulances and emergency vehicles of
33	municipal and county departments, public service corporations
34	operated by private corporations, the Fish and Wildlife
35	Conservation Commission, the Department of Environmental
36	Protection, the Department of Transportation, the Department of

40 sheriff of any county may operate emergency lights and sirens in an emergency. Wreckers, mosquito control fog and spray vehicles, 41 and emergency vehicles of governmental departments or public 42 43 service corporations may show or display amber lights when in actual operation or when a hazard exists provided they are not 44 45 used going to and from the scene of operation or hazard without specific authorization of a law enforcement officer or law 46 47 enforcement agency. Wreckers must use amber rotating or flashing 48 lights while performing recoveries and loading on the roadside 49 day or night, and may use such lights while towing a vehicle on wheel lifts, slings, or under reach if the operator of the 50 51 wrecker deems such lights necessary. A flatbed, car carrier, or 52 rollback may not use amber rotating or flashing lights when 53 hauling a vehicle on the bed unless it creates a hazard to other 54 motorists because of protruding objects. Further, escort 55 vehicles may show or display amber lights when in the actual 56 process of escorting overdimensioned equipment, material, or 57 buildings as authorized by law. Vehicles owned or leased by 58 private security agencies may show or display green and amber 59 lights, with either color being no greater than 50 percent of the lights displayed, while the security personnel are engaged 60 in security duties on private or public property. 61

(7) Flashing lights are prohibited on vehicles except:

(c) For the lamps authorized under subsections (1), (2), (3), (4), and (9), s. 316.2065, or <u>s. 316.235(6)</u> s. 316.235(5) which may flash.

Section 3. Section 316.2398, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

316.2398 Display or use of red or red and white warning



69 signals; motor vehicles of volunteer firefighters or medical 70 staff.-

(1) A privately owned vehicle belonging to an active 71 72 firefighter member of a regularly organized volunteer 73 firefighting company or association, while en route to the fire 74 station for the purpose of proceeding to the scene of a fire or 75 other emergency or while en route to the scene of a fire or 76 other emergency in the line of duty as an active firefighter 77 member of a regularly organized firefighting company or 78 association, may display or use red or red and white warning 79 signals. or A privately owned vehicle belonging to a medical 80 staff physician or technician of a medical facility licensed by 81 the state, while responding to an emergency in the line of duty, 82 may display or use red warning signals. Warning signals must be 83 visible from the front and from the rear of such vehicle, 84 subject to the following restrictions and conditions:

(a) No more than two red <u>or red and white</u> warning signals may be displayed.

(b) No inscription of any kind may appear across the face of the lens of the red <u>or red and white</u> warning signal.

89 (c) In order for an active volunteer firefighter to display 90 such red or red and white warning signals on his or her vehicle, 91 the volunteer firefighter must first secure a written permit from the chief executive officers of the firefighting 92 93 organization to use the red or red and white warning signals, 94 and this permit must be carried by the volunteer firefighter at 95 all times while the red or red and white warning signals are 96 displayed.

(2) <u>A It is unlawful for any</u> person who is not an active



98 firefighter member of a regularly organized volunteer 99 firefighting company or association or a physician or technician 00 of the medical staff of a medical facility licensed by the state 01 <u>may not</u> to display on any motor vehicle owned by him or her, at 02 any time, any red <u>or red and white</u> warning signals as described 03 in subsection (1).

(3) It is unlawful for An active volunteer firefighter <u>may</u> <u>not</u> to operate any red <u>or red and white</u> warning signals as authorized in subsection (1), except while en route to the fire station for the purpose of proceeding to the scene of a fire or other emergency, or while at or en route to the scene of a fire or other emergency, in the line of duty.

(4) It is unlawful for A physician or technician of the medical staff of a medical facility <u>may not</u> to operate any red warning signals as authorized in subsection (1), except when responding to an emergency in the line of duty.

(5) A violation of this section is a nonmoving violation, punishable as provided in chapter 318. In addition, <u>a</u> any volunteer firefighter <u>who violates this section</u> shall be dismissed from membership in the firefighting organization by the chief executive officers thereof.

Section 4. Subsection (3) of section 316.224, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

316.224 Color of clearance lamps, identification lamps, side marker lamps, backup lamps, reflectors, and deceleration lights.-

(3) All lighting devices and reflectors mounted on the rear
of any vehicle shall display or reflect a red color, except the
stop light or other signal device, which may be red, amber, or
