7 (16) Adopt a payment schedule that encompasses all program  
 8 funded under this part and part V of this chapter. The payment  
 9 schedule must take into consideration the prevailing average  
 10 market rate, include the projected number of all children to be  
 11 served, and be submitted for approval by the department ~~office~~.  
 12 Informal child care arrangements shall be reimbursed at not more  
 13 than 50 percent of the rate adopted for a family day care home.

14 (17) Implement an anti-fraud plan addressing the detection,  
 15 reporting, and prevention of overpayments, abuse, and fraud  
 16 relating to the provision of and payment for school readiness
